INFORMATION FROM THE PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

Thoughtful placement of books on the shelves can limit damage incurred by unnecessary and improper handling. They should not be placed on their fore-edge. Shelves should not be loaded beyond their carrying capacity and, wherever possible, space should be left for future expansion.

Books and records of permanent value must be protected from the deteriorating effects of extreme variations in temperature and humidity, air pollution, the energy in natural and artificial light, fire, mold, vermin, insects, and water damage.
