

Dear Pride Attendees.

Be glad you don't have to hear that mess of off key, flat notes.

At any rate, today I can answer that I feel proud because I have helped to bring this community the Lexington Pride Festival. This year is our 6 from beginning to end. 
How do we bring about change for LGBT Kentuckians?
