### Regents name UK graduate 11th president of Kentucky State

FRANKFORT, Ky. — UK graduate Mary L. Smith was named the 11th president of Kentucky State University yesterday.

The Board of Regents selected Smith, 55, on a 6-3 vote after it met in executive session for more than two hours.

The selection comes after months of struggle between the board and John T. Wolfe Jr., who resigned as president Oct. 18. Wolfe was the third consecutive KSU president to resign under fire from the regents. The three regents who voted against the motion to appoint Smith were Edythe Jones Hayes, John Johnson and student member Chris Rasheed. All said they would support Smith but wanted a formal

search.
Others who voted for Smith said
KSU could not wait for a search to
be conducted.
"Though there's a good argument
to be made that a thorough search

to be made that a thorough search should be conducted, there's an equally or more compelling one that we secure sound leadership at TSU." said faculty regent Kichard Taylor. "KSU needs a nurturer and a healer at this point."

After her appointment, Smith spoke to the board and called upon the divided campus to come together for the betterment of students. "It is my hope that I will be able to obtain the support and cooperation from the entire university family," Smith said.

### Six UK divers qualify for NCAA preliminary meet

On All Hallows Eve, a night colored black by whipping wind and rustling leaves, the UK men's and women's swimming and diving teams clamped down on Transyl-tonia University's jugular like Count Dracula on a bare neck.

The Katfish wasted no time in marking their turf in this crosstown match-up, as they swain-wisted and dove their way to a 119-99 men's victory, and a 142-50-78-50 women's victory last night at the Harry C. Lancaster. In diving, six Katfish produced scores high enough to qualify for the NCAA Zone meet, (a preliminary to the NCAA championships). The zone meet will be held in March in Tallahassee, Fla., at Florida State University.

March in Tallahassee, Fla., at Florida State University.
Heather Pollard, Michelle Parsons, Julie Robbins and Noel Pieratt qualified for the zone meet, surpassing the minimum 245 score on the 1-meter dive. Pollard won the event with a 261.30, edging out Parsons' 261.00.
Robbins, Parsons and Pollard

also qualified in the 3-meter, achieving higher than the minimum score of 255. Robbins won the event with a 289,73.

Qualifying for the zone meet in men's diving were Jamie Smawley and Ted Waldeyer, who scored above the 290-point minimum on the 1-meter dive. Smawley won the event with a 303.00. He and Waldeyer anassing point totals above the 310-point minimum. Waldeyer tallied a 317.85, while Smawley won the event with a 336.60 total.



Kentucky sophomore guard Tra-vis Ford will be sidelined for six weeks after suffering a non-displaced fracture of the left knee cap in the Blue-White scrimmage Tuesday night, UK trainer JoAnn Hauser said yesterday.

"This is an unfortunate situation, as Travis Ford is an important member of our basketball team," said basketball coach Rick Pitino. "Hopefully, though, we will have him back in time for the Southwest Texas State game (Dec.10)."

Surgery will not be necessary, side of the court toward Memorial Ford's leg will be placed in an immobilizer for about three weeks remaining in the second half. Ford with non-weight bearing rehabilitation, after which he will undergo about three more weeks of rehabilitation, Hauser said.

### Trick or treat? New King novel seems familiar

Stephen King Viking (690 pp. \$24.95)

"You've been here before," Ste-

"You've been here before," Stephen King begins with in his newest
novel, Needful Things. "Sure you
have. Sure. I never forget a face."
Yes, we have been here before. It
feels very familiar.
King's most recent book is billed
as "the last Castle Rock story." For
those of you who are unfamiliar
with the mythical town in Maine,
Castle Rock has been the setting for
many of King's works including,
The Dead Zone, Cujo, The Dark
Half and the novellas "The Body"
and "The Sun Dog."
And he doesn't let us forget it.

And he doesn't let us forget it. Needful Things picks up where The Dark Half and "The Sun Dog"

George Bannerman after he was killed by Joe Camber's dog Cujo, and investigated the bizarre murders and Thad Beaumont in *The Dark Half*— is one of the central characters in King's new novel. But there are many other characters. In fact, perhaps too many.

A newcomer to Castle Rock opens up a strange, new shop called Needful Things. There is something there for everyone, it seems, and at a fair price. But there is, of course, a darker side to this shop, You see, although the purchases were bargains, the customers paid not only with cash. They also had to play a trick on someone. "A Harmless little on someone. "A Harmless little on someone. "A Harmless little bamlet of Castle Rock. Sheriff Pangborn feels it but doesn't know what it is. He suspects that the town's newest resident and businessman may be a confidence man.

King's verbosity is helped, in part, with his wry sense of humor. He doesn't mind playing little jokes on the readers as well as his characters. For instance, when Poly Chalmers — who was the first customer in the new shop, some-

town, we are told — goes out on Town Road No. 3 to the old Camber place, she thinks she

hears a low, deep growl. In the barn she sees two red eyes staring out at her. The kind of eyes that could belong to a monster or maybe a rabid dog.

But it's not just the references to his other works that make this novel seem so familiar. It's the story itself. At times it seems like a parody of a Stephen King book: The themes are not new. King explored what can happen when a stranger enters a small town in his second novel 'Salem's Lot. (And Castle Rock is essentially, Jerusalem's Lot with a slightly different setting.) The conflict between good and evil is an important theme in his fiction, but never has been better explored than in The Stand.

King's best works are the ones that make the reader think, "That could happen." That is what is so disturbing about Cujo and even The Dead Zone. It also is what makes his other books like The Dark Half and Needful Things seem ridiculous

True, King is a writer of fantasy, like Ray Bradbury and Clive Barker. And he is one of the finest: To some he is the "master" of the genre. But Needful Things is not of his best books.

Reading the Castle Rock stories sequentially, they make an enter-taining opus of small-town life. Read the works mentioned above, and others like *The Tommyknockers* and "Mrs. Todd's Shortcut," first, and you will get more from this book.

King seems to have written it with a pre-supposed familiarity with these works.

Yes, Steve, we have been here before. And somehow it seemed better before. The dialogue has been better and the characters have been better developed. Still, the trip was fun, although it was a long journey.

"The Hunger" (1983) — One of the most sophisticated, elegant and sexy vampire thrillers ever made. David Bowie, Catherine Deneuve and Susan Sarandon star in this lover's triangle that turns to blood-lust.

### Memory can be improved by learning easy techniques

Dear Counselor:
My memory is terrible! I have to spend hours and hours going over my notes and reading assignments in order for them to sink in. A lot of school seems to be memory work. Is there anything I can do to memorize things better? Help!
Liz, business freshman

Dear Liz:
You are correct in your observation that memory is a key element
in being a successful student. Although many college courses concentrate on more advanced thinking
skills such as application and synthesis of knowledge, memory slip
plays a key role in making these
processes more effective. Left size
a look at a key concept related to
memory.

Memory.

One way to approach memory is to realize that no one really has a "bad" memory. It is either *trained* 

or untrained. Most of us never have had formal training on how to remember. About the only advice we ever received was, "Well, read and recite the material until you know it by heart." This method works but can be highly ineffective because of the time required.

In his book, Becoming a Matter Student, David Ellis discusses 12 techniques to develop a more sufficient memory. The techniques mot meant to be restrictive but should be used in different combinations and adapted to meet your learning situations. If you consistently use these techniques, the results may surprise you.

\*Learn from the general to the specific. Get familiar with the "big picture" first by skimming and surveying and then get more specific. This process assists your brain in organizing the information for more efficient recall.

"Create associations. Memory association! What we know now a based on information we already awe learned. Link new information on with old information by using reative acronyms and mnemonic business.

-Reduce interference. Avoid distractions. Your study environment and habits may be draining your energy to concentrate — turn off the TV. take frequent breaks, padlock the refrigerator.

-Overlearn. Immerse yourself in the subject to fight mental "fuzziness." By learning it inside and out (not just enough to pass the test) you can better apply the knowledge in problem-solving situations.

-Be aware of attitudes. Take responsibility for your attitudes —

sponsibility for your attitudes — they can affect your ability to recall information. For example, viewing a subject as boring can affect your

concentration and attention span.

Distribute learning. Break up marathon study sessions into shorter segments spaced over a longer period of time. You avoid cramming, which is analogous to training for a marathon the day before the race (it's not very effective). By distributing your learning, you will retain more information.

Remember something else. If you get stuck and can't remember an item, think of something that is related to that item. Many times the association process will 'jog' your memory. This also is the concept behind brainstorming.

Combine memory techniques.

•Combine memory techniques.
Use what works! Combine tech-

niques to maximize retention. Experiment for yourself.

Liz, this should give you a good start in developing your memory. However, if you are intersted in learning more about improving your memory or other study skills such as time management, textbook reading, note taking and test taking, consider talking with a learning skills counselor at the Counseling and Testing Center or enrolling in the Master Student Program. Either of these options will be a good investment in your academic success.
