I Lucretia Clay being of feeble health but sound mind, aware of the uncertainty of life, do make & publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling any will heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I give to my daughter Mary, wife of my son Thomas H Clay, the sum of two hundred dollars to and for her sole and separate use, also my gold watch, and my rockaway carriage and harness.

Item 2^d I give to my daughter Susan, wife of my son James B Clay, the sum of one hundred dollars to and for her sole and separate use

Item 3^d I give to my son James B Clay the rocking chair which I have used the last years of my life

Item 4th I give to my son John M Clay the sum of one thousand dollars; also all the live stock, furniture, waggons, tools, harness, implements and personal property of every kind which were brought by me to his place, or which I may have since acquired,

except
