# HOUSING AND POPULATION CENSUS REPORTS DELAYED

The Government Printing Office reports that as of October 31, 1980, no 1980 Census of Population and Housing Reports have been issued. The preliminary reports are expected by the end of this year. However, the advanced and final reports will be delayed 6 to 18 months due to pending lawsuits (as a result of Detroit's charges of undercount). These final reports will not be released until litigation has cleared the counts.
