LIQUID HOSPITALITY

"If a large part of the audience insists on be-coming intoxicated instead of watching the game, thousands of disgusted fans are certain to stay away from future contests.'

Such is the comment which appeared on the editorial page of one of the local newspapers, following a letter received by the editor from three local citizens who were commenting on this growing menace. The Kernel last Friday issued a warning to the student body concerning the action of the Student Council on such matters.

We hoped that the disgraceful conduct displayed at the Georgia Tech game would not be

noticed by anyone but the students, but appar-ently our hopes were in vain, as is evidenced by the letter to the editor of the local newspaper. When the condition reaches this height, per

suasion must give way to action, if the growing menace is to be checked.

Ohio State has shown that it will not tolerate drinking in its stadium, by warning its patrons before the game and rigidly enforcing its ruling The Lexington police force has promised its cooperation in halting excessive drinking, and this collaboration with the Student Council will be all the University of Kentucky athletic authorities need to curb the comparative few who feel that liquor is a necessity at a football game.

Saturday is Home-coming and we want all those who come back to enjoy themselves as much

as possible, but this does not go so far as to per mit them to disturb those persons who are un-fortunate enough to be seated near them. Ken-tucky has always been noted for its hospitality, and has always been proud of the fact. Can it be that this hospitality is not genuine, but must be coaxed out of a bottle? The Kernel does not believe that drastic action

will be necessary, but in the event it is, we urge the enforcement of the ruling to its greatest ex-tent. The home-coming game will present a good test of whether Kentuckians can still be hospitable when they leave their liquor at ho


