

Wachs 17. Jan. 1834

My dear Son

It has been some time since I had a letter from you. The last was that which gave me a survey of my Wester resources of provision, for which I am greatly obliged to you. I hope you will continue to keep me informed of whatever is passing at Rockland that is interesting for me to know.

I have drawn on you to day for \$1000 payable the 2^d of March next, and I wish the draft to be paid out of resources which I will now indicate. There is a note for \$1200 of Mess R. & Buchanan due in Feb. at the Bank which I expect will be paid, and if it should be it will be more than sufficient. I send also herewith an order on Mess Gray & Hooker for \$300 rent due on the first of March. I expect also that Mr. Martin will have deposited money to my credit at the Bank. If he has omitted to do so I will thank you to desire him to deposit any monies of mine there. Out of these resources you will be able to pay the bill; but if they should fail, draw on me for the deficit.

I have also drawn to day a check on the Bank at New York for \$600 deposited there to my credit by Mr. Hooker day of Winchester. I will thank you to call and see and let me know if the deposit were made as he assures me.
