

Washington 10th Dec. 1836

My dear son

I received your letter of the 3^d inst. with the note and check enclosed, which are now returned executed as you desire.

I am sorry to learn that Blossom was not in calf as I supposed she was, and still hope that notwithstanding she has taken your bull, she may be yet in calf; but if not, I shall be glad to get a calf from her by Lord Althorp. Whenever my cows are done with him (what will be ascertained by time) I wish you to relieve yourself from their care by sending them to Oakland.

I wrote you a few days ago and refer to that letter. It is as warm here to day as a September day.
