Law of Louisiana. La belonged to Spain 34 years and a few
months. Napoleon then obtained possession of it in 1803: and in
the same year in the month of November it was ceded to the United States
By a special proclamation the Black Code given by Louis the 15th
to the province, excepting such parts of it as were inconsistent with
the constitution and laws of the United States, was declared to be in
force. The first code of the Territory was made by Moreau Lislet
and James Beron ^{in 1808}. It was drawn up on the basis of the Napoleon
