The attention of parents, guardians, and friends of Cadets, is called, *particularly*, to the following Regulations; which are indispensable to the welfare of the Academy, and must be enforced strictly and literally in all cases. Every infraction inflicts a direct injury on the Cadet, and an indirect one on the Institution. The provision made for the Cadet by the Government is ample:

REGULATIONS, *par.* 69 . . . When any Cadet shall have a number expressing his demerit on the General Conduct Roll greater than 200 for any *one* year, such Cadet shall be declared deficient in conduct, and be recommended by the Academic Board to the War Department for discharge.

REGULATIONS, *par.* 141 . . . No Cadet shall apply for, or receive money, or any other supplies, from his parents, or from any person whomsoever, without permission from the Secretary of War, on recommendation of the Superintendent; any infraction or violation of which will be considered a positive disobedience of orders, and punished accordingly.
