Wash. 2^d June 1838.

I had some papers respecting land in Missouri, relating to a New Madrid claim in the name of Bonneau, a plat and Certificate of Survey, deeds or assignments &c. I thought that I had brought them with me to this City, but have not been able to find them, and think it probable that I left them on my table in the Office. They are probably in or with a letter from Beverly Allen Esq. I wish that you would search for them & if you can find them send them to me immediately by the Mail. I wrote to your mother yesterday requesting her to communicate my wishes about the Bale Rope. I sent to you I believe the letter of Dr. Duncan, expressing his wishes as to the places of delivery of the Rope on the Mississippi which I think to be attended to.
