TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING.

KNOW YE, That in pursuance of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to raise for a limited time, an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847, *Marcellus Harris, late a private in Captain Evans' Company First Regiment Texas Cavalry,*
having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in *his* favor, numbered *49771.*

There is therefore granted by the United States unto *William A. M^o Donnell, assignee* of said *Marcellus Harris, and to his heirs,* the West half of the North West quarter and the South East quarter of the North West quarter of Section thirty in Township three, South of Range, ten West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vincennes, Indiana, containing one hundred and nine acres seventy three hundredths of an acre,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *Parts of said* section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *William A. M^o Donnell, and to his* heirs and assigns forever.
