in front of his regiment, against an
overwhelming force of the Enemy, and when
wounded and helpless, giving as his last
words of command to his men, an order to
secure their own safety, and leave him to
the fate which he soon suffered, from the
bayonets of the savage and merciless foe.

Resolved, That the mingled grief and ad-
miration excited by the peculiar circumstan-
ces of exalted courage and self-sacrifice,
which characterized the fall of this young
hero, dying (as was recorded in the epitaph
