Down from the heights of Heaven the eloquent voice of the Sainted Patriot and Sage comes thrilling to our hearts, in the touching language of Paternal affection,—"May you too die the death of the righteous,"—and readily, heartily, and solemnly do we respond—"May our end be like his."
