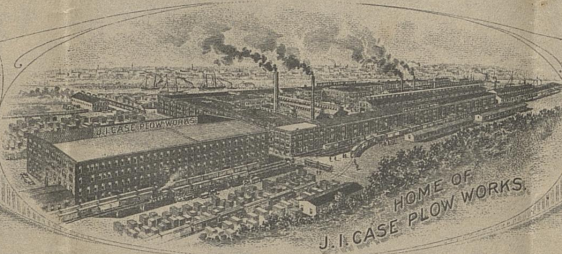
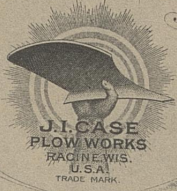
Dear Alleine & Yates:--
