Gov. Johnson Names Stoll And Palmore

H. D. Palmore, Class of '14, was appointed, and Judge Richard C. Stoll, Class of '95, was re-appointed, to the Board of Trustees by Governor Keen Johnson on January 28.

H. D. Palmore, Frankfort, Class of 1914, president and general manager of the Kentucky Concrete Pipe Company, Incorporated, was named as the alumni member of the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees by Governor Keen Johnson on January 28. The appointment of Mr. Palmore fills the vacancy created by the expiration of the term of Louis E. Hillenmeyer, Class of 1907.

Judge Richard C. Stoll, who has been a member of the Board of Trustees of the University for the past 42 years, was re-appointed by Governor Johnson for another six-year term, at the close of which he will have completed almost a half-century of service to his Alma Mater as a member of the Board of Trustees. He is chairman of the Executive Committee of the Board and also chairman of the Board of Control of the Agricultural Experiment Station. Judge Stoll entered the University, then State College, in 1891, graduating in 1895. He obtained his law degree from Yale two years later. His first appointment to the board was January 2, 1898, by Governor William O. Bradley, giving him a record of 50 years of continuous service with the University, excepting

Scores Of UK Men Serving Uncle Sam

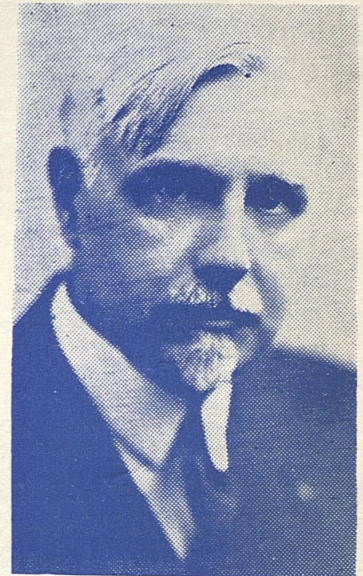

Graham On Duty In War Department

For many years a consultant in engineering and industrial matters in the United States and abroad, Colonel James Hiram Graham, Dean of the College of Engineering at the University, is now on duty in Washington, D. C. as technical adviser on the staff of Brigadier General Brehon Somervell, War Department General Staff, Supply Division G-44.

Colonel Graham has contributed greatly in engineering and national defense. He received a B. S. Civil Engineering degree from the University in 1900, and a Civil Engineering degree in 1903.

Commissioned on July 16, 1917 as captain in the Engineers Officer Reserve Corps, he was placed on the active list and ordered overseas to France, July 31, 1917. Dean Graham was then sent with the American Expeditionary Forces to Paris, France, and assigned to duty under Chief Engineer Line of Communication, A. E. F. During September, 1917, he was placed in charge of organizing Engineer Depots and Engineer supplies, serving as such until April of the following year.

During December, 1917, and January, 1918, Colonel Graham served on the Board of Engineers to report on Bassans Dock, Bordeaux, France. In February, he served on the Board of Engineers to report on and plan the entire Port Program for the A.E.F.

Dean Graham was transferred from Engineer Supply Section and made Chief of the

Section of Railway and Dock Construction, Department of Construction and Forestry in May of 1918.

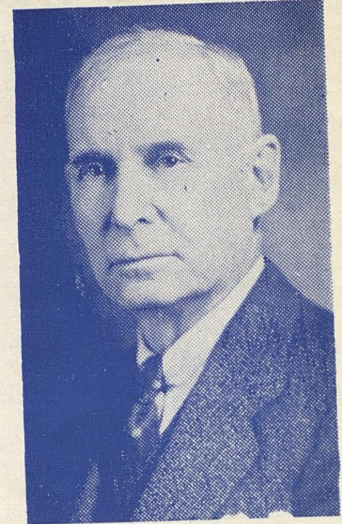
Promoted to Major of Engineers in June, 1918, Dean Graham was then promoted to Lieut. Colonel of Engineers the following August. While still acting as Chief of Section for Railway and Dock Construction, the Dean was made Chief of Road and Highway Repair in January, 1919, and as such had general supervision of repair of all highways in France and occupied Germany. He was promoted to Colonel of Engineers the following month.

In May, 1919, Dean Graham was assigned to duty with the United States Liquidation Commission, War Department. He was made Executive Officer of the Commission in July, 1919, and on the 26th, he was appointed by the Secretary of War as member of the Liquidation Commission. Colonel Graham was honorably discharged as Colonel of Engineers, August 12, 1919, and performed duty of commissioner in civilian capacity.

The Cross Legion Honor was awarded the Colonel in behalf of the Republic of France in April 1919. During the same month, he was cited by Commander in Chief of the A.E.F., of the United States, for exceptionally meritorious and conspicuous service.

Col. Graham was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal by the President of the United States on May 31, 1919, for exceptionally meritorious and distinguished services in position of great responsibility.

A member of Kappa Alpha social fraternity, Dean Graham is the author of the book, "Joseph, the Husband of Mary".

DEAN MELCHER HAS LONG AND USEFUL CAREER

Dean Columbus R. Melcher smiled as he told the Alumni reporter that "there were many boys and only a few girls on the campus when I first came to the University." Formerly the Dean of Men at the University, Dean Melcher, now professor emeritus, has the remarkable ability of talking and being interesting at the same time.

Coming to the University in 1907 as assistant professor of modern languages, Dean Melcher has belonged to the "University family" for 35 years. He became associate professor in 1908; professor 1909, Dean of Men in 1914, and head of the German department from 1917 until 1933 when he was retired.

Dean Melcher, who was born in Vevay, Indiana, received his A. B. degree from Hanover College, 1885; A. M. degree in 1890, LL. D. in 1895; and attended the Universities of Munich and Leipzig, 1886-88. He received his LL. D. degree from the University of Louisville, 1896, and attended the University of Chicago in 1900-01.

Prior to the time he came to the University, Dean Melcher was principal of Vevay high school, 1885-86, superintendent of schools at Carrollton, Kentucky, 1889-95, principal of Reynolds Presbyterian Academy, Albany, Texas, 1901-02, and professor of ancient and modern languages at Hanover College from 1902 until 1907, his first year at the University of Kentucky.

An outstanding professor, the biographical sketch of Dean Mecher is included in "Who Who In Kentucky". A member of Delta Tau Delta social fraternity, the Dean is also an alumnus of Omicron Delta Kappa, senior men's honorary. He was president of the conference of Deans of Men, 1925-26 and was a "dollar a year man" during the first World War.

the two years at Yale. In 1882 the separation of Kentucky State College and Transylvania was effected, so Judge Stoll has been actively connected with the University since it became a separate institution, with the exception of 11 years. The University is to be congratulated upon having the loyal services of such an outstanding alumnus.

Mr. Palmore has been an active alumnus of the University since '14. He is a life member of the Alumni Association, is chairman of the Alumni Membership Committee for 1941-42, and a member of the Alumni Executive Committee. The recent organization of the Frankfort Alumni Club, which has been so very active in the last few months in promoting the program of the University, was encouraged through the efforts of Mr. Palmore.

Mr. Palmore was graduated in the Class of 1914 from the College of Engineering, returning to the University in 1931 for advanced work. He has been Chief Engineer of the Kentucky State Highway Department; City Manager of Covington, Kentucky; Principal of the Glasgow High School, and at the present time is Chairman of the Disaster Committee of the Red Cross. He is active in the American Legion in Franklin County; and in many other civic and welfare groups, both in his county and in the state. He is secretary of the Kentucky Association of Highway Contractors and is serving his second term as President of the American Concrete Pipe Association.

This distinguished alumnus enlisted in the U. S. army in April, 1917 and served with the 77th division. In May, 1919 he was discharged from the army with a rank of Captain of Infantry, having served in France for a number of months as a member of the AEF.

The Palmore family has been represented on the campus for a number of years, the following having attended, including a son, James A. Palmore; a daughter, Eloise Palmore; two brothers, Richard Palmore and J. Stanley Palmore; two sisters, Emma L. Palmore and Addina Palmore; four nephews, Reginald E. Palmore, Reginald E. Palmore, Jr., Oren R. Depp, and Robert Palmore; three nieces, Runelle Palmore, Mattigene Palmore, and Mabel A. Palmore; and two cousins, Ewing L. Palmore and Ewing L. Palmore, Jr. You may readily see that this is quite an example of intense loyalty to the University.

U. K. Announces Total War Program

As the result of an extensive study made by the University Faculty, the program of the University of Kentucky for cooperating in the total war effort of the United States has recently been announced. The University has pledged the support of the entire staff to cooperate to the fullest degree with the plans of the Federal Government and the armed forces for the prosecution of the war. The program says—"The University of Kentucky believes with national leaders that in the present emergency retention of fundamental values—for example, civil rights, health, recreation, education, spiritual development—becomes increasingly important. In contrast such luxuries as long vacations and business as usual must be eliminated and the ordinary pace of education, government, and civic life must be quickened. The goal of the University of Kentucky is therefore to provide a greater educational effort by both faculty and students without necessarily sacrificing the morale building values of recreation, athletics, and social life."

The University, of course, will continue to make extensive contributions of leadership in its many fields, in addition to which an even greater contribution will be made to the total war effort of the nation through providing a continuous and ever-increasing flow of young man power equipped to serve most effectively the armed forces and other essential agencies of our government. In order that this may be done, the University will provide an opportunity for all entering freshman students of complete their regular University course in three years.

This program makes it possible for young men and women to secure University training in order that they may be able to serve their nation to the fullest extent.

The quarter system plan thus becomes effective in June, 1942. Students may attend three quarters annually and finish in the usual four years or by attending all four quarters they may finish in three years. Under the quarter system, for the first time the Reserve Officers Training Corps will be maintained during the summer of 1942.

The University also offers to the government the use of its plant including laboratory facilities and its entire physical resources for providing for the special training or instruction of groups of the armed forces. The services of the faculties of the six colleges and of the Graduate School are offered to the Government to provide instruction and training for such groups.

His recognized leadership, his demonstrated loyalty to the University, and his knowledge of University affairs, all indicate the services which he will be able to render to the University and to the Alumni Association as a member of the Board of Trustees.
