PRITCHARD LECTURE

R. W. B. Lewis, the celebrated literary scholar and critic, will deliver the first Edward F. Pritchard, Jr. Lecture in Lexington on Friday, 12 March, at the University of Kentucky's Spindletop Hall.

Lewis, the Pulitzer Prize-winning biographer of Edith Wharton and a literary consultant to Universal Pictures Studios, will replace the previously scheduled speaker, Alfred Kazin, who has suffered a heart attack.

A native of Chicago, Richard Lewis was educated at the English School in Switzerland, Exeter Academy, and Harvard. He received his doctorate from the University of Chicago in 1953. He taught at Bennington College, Smith College, Princeton and Rutgers before joining the Yale faculty in 1959.

During the 1950s he was active in Europe as the Dean of the Salzburg Seminar in American Studies, as Kenyon Fellow in Criticism in Florence and as a Fulbright Lecturer at the University of Munich.

Lewis is author of THE AMERICAN ADAM (1955), THE PICARESQUE SAINT (1959), TRIALS OF THE WORD (1965), THE POETRY OF HART CRANE (1967) and EDITH WHARTON: A BIOGRAPHY (1975). His Wharton book was named one of the Notable Books of 1975. He has also carried out work on Melville, Whitman and Malraux.

Lewis will speak about his research on a major biographical work now in progress, a study of the author Henry James and his brother William James, the psychologist.

The dinner meeting is open to all. The cost is \$12 per person, and reservations must be made by Wednesday, 10 March. For additional information, call the Director's Office at 257-3801.
