

Will of John R. Jones

I, John R. Jones of Nelson County, Kentucky do here by make my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say firstly, after the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I give my wife, Anna C. Jones, the farm and tract of land and premises laying at Glenville, Washington County, Kentucky together with all of its bountaries in which Dr. J. C. Bascom now lives. J. C. One dining table and cloth and one parlor table, one dozen chairs, and a set of cooking utensils, two sets of fiar dogs and all the carpets on the floor. Also a cary plough and two shovel ploughs, a wagan, two pair of gear and my buggy and harness, two cows and calves, two grown horses, thirty hogs, ten sheep, fifty dunghill hens, also I give to my wife a black man, Henry and Billy, a black woman, Lueasa and Letty and also all the corn, wheat, and hay and old corn, wheat and hay enough to last until the new is ripe and growing in the place at my death. I will the above named property to my wife during her natural life and to her children forever if she should have any, but if she should not have any children at her death she may give one-half of said property to whom she will and the other half to be divided equally among my grandchildren-- Imis G.
