The faculty met in regular session on Monday, April 9, 1917, with quorum present.

The following report from the Committee of Dean was read by Dr. Terrell, Chairman of Committee on Proposed Faculty Legislation; was adopted as read:

ROUTINE BUSINESS

The Commandant was authorized to drill the battalion five days in the week.

The President was authorized to extend an invitation to President Benjamin Ide Wheeler to deliver the address at our next Commencement.

GRADUATE SCHOOL COMMITTEE

The request of Mr. James T. Madison to be considered for the degree of C.E. to be given in June, was granted. His thesis, presented with the application, was referred to a Committee consisting of Professors Freeman, Daniel Terrell, Barr and Dr. Boyd.

DEBATABLE CLASS

The following resolution suggested by the Committee on Proposed Faculty Legislation was adopted as recommended:

In regard to the automatic rule for dropping students or for placing them on probation for failure in work or the prohibition of such students to represent the college in any form of public contest or exercise, it shall be the duty of any student who is a candidate for a position in such contest or exercise to present to the committee or individual making such an appointment a certificate of the Registrar's, showing that he is eligible for such position according to the rules of the college, above referred to.

The following resolution suggested by Dr. Tuttle was referred to a special committee composed of the Registrar, Doctors Tuttle and Dantzler and Professors Weaver and Baker:

That the number of courses in catalogue be changed so that all Freshman classes shall be numbered from 1 to 100, Sophomore classes from 200 to 300, Junior classes from 300 to 400 and Senior classes from 400 to 500. Also that the list

of students in back of catalogue in addition to college shall show the major subject of the student.

The following resolution from the Committee of Deans was passed as recommended:

Ordered that the President and Captain Fairfax be authorized to extend to citizens of the town the offer of an opportunity to drill as companies on the college campus.

The faculty voted unanimously to confer the degree of LL.D. upon President Benjamin Ide Wheeler of the University of California, as presented by the Graduate School Committee.

On motion of Professor Davis the faculty voted that no other name than that of President Benjamin Ide Wheeler be considered for the degree of LL.D. this year.

The faculty voted to confer the degree of Doctor of Science on Professor A. R. Crandall, formerly of the State College of Kentucky.

The following resolution passed by the Executive Committee of the University of Kentucky was received and filed.

"WHEREAS, a state of war exists between the United States of America and the Imperial German Government; and

WHEREAS, there may be students in this University who may desire to volunteer for service in the army or navy of the United States;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Executive Committee of the University of Kentucky as follows:

1. If any student be a member of the Senior Class of the University and he enlist for service in the Army or Navy of the United States, he shall be graduated at the regular commencement in June and receive his degree and diploma without any further examinations.

2. If any student be a member of the Junior, Sophomore or Freshman Class and he enlist for service in the army or navy of the United States, he shall be entitled upon his return to enter the next advanced class in all respects as if his examinations had successfully been taken at the end of the collegiate year.

3. If any student so enlisting shall notify the President of the University of that fact."
