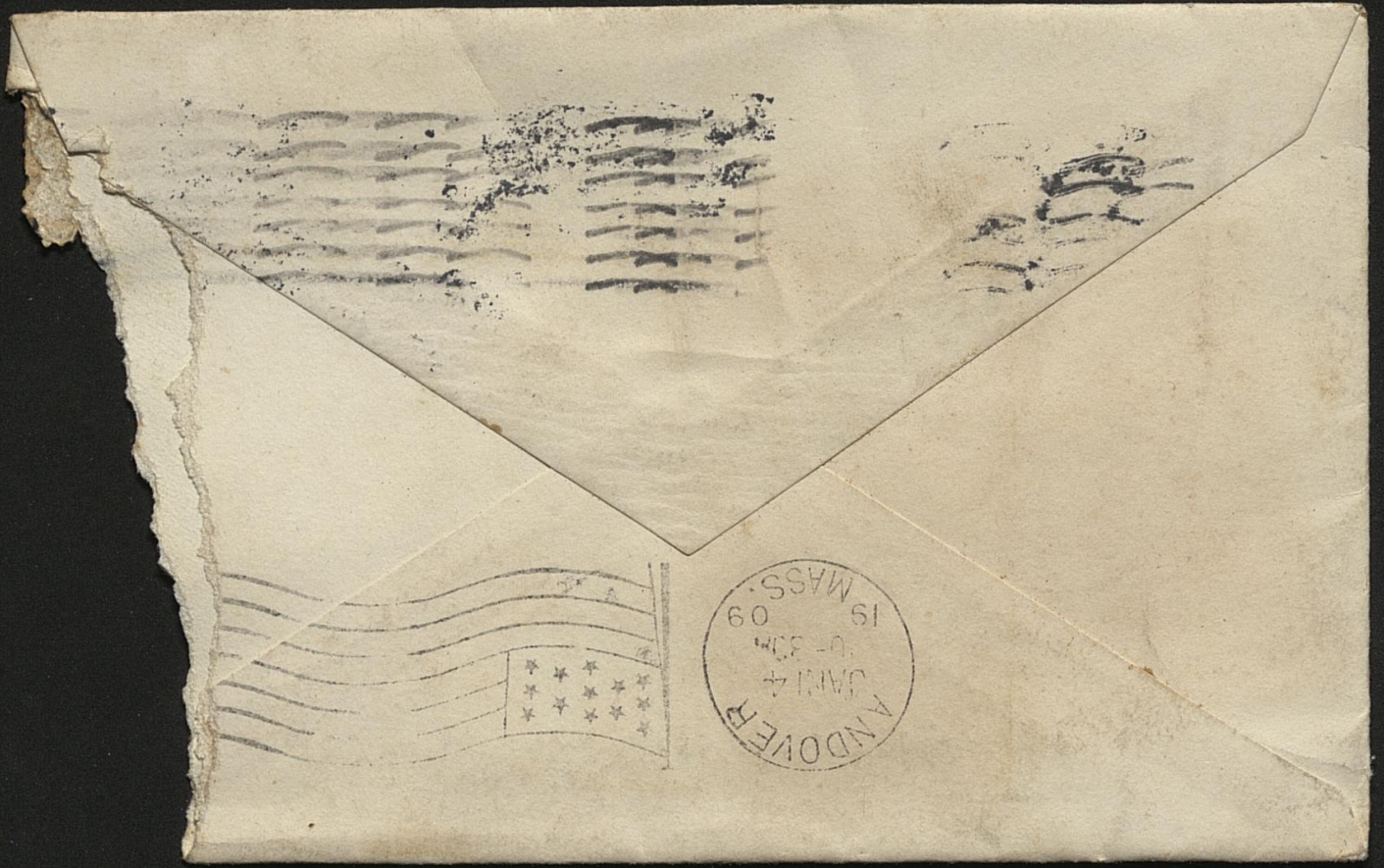

POLICE HAVE A SUICIDE PUZZLE

Woman Phones—Hangs Up Receiver Before Giving Victim's Name.

Police on the south side were instructed to-day to make a diligent search for the body of a supposed suicide in 55th street. Information of the suicide was given at the coroner's office in such a manner as to shroud the case in mystery. It was given by a woman who refused to give her name or address. She was weeping and sobbing as she spoke to Chief Deputy Coroner David Jones and in her confusion she gave the first name of the supposed suicide; then she stopped and hung up the receiver.

Whether the suicide was a man or woman, young or old, was not learned in the coroner's office. The woman, however, said that the location of the tragedy was in 55th street. According to Mr. Jones she was evidently so confused that the bits of information she gave were spoken unguardedly and when she found that she was giving information that she had not intended to give she hung up the receiver.

According to Mr. Jones the voices of several other persons could be heard near the sobbing woman at the other end of the wire and there was evidently great confusion. The conversation over the telephone between Mr. Jones and the woman was as follows:

Q.—"Is this the coroner's office?" A.—"Yes."

After some hesitation the next question came as follows:

Q.—"If a person commits suicide by shooting will be a post-mortem examination have to be held?" A.—"No."

Q.—"Is it necessary to hold an inquest?" A.—"Oh, yes. You couldn't get a certificate of death without an inquest. Has some one committed suicide?"

"Yes," followed by sobbing.

Q.—"Who is it?" A.—"Oh, dear, I don't want to tell."

Q.—"Where does the person live?" A.—"On the south side."

Q.—"Whereabouts on the south side?" A.—"Fifty-fifth street."

"What number?"

Sobbing and excited conversation were heard at the other end of the wire by Mr. Jones and the question was not answered.

"What is the name of the person?" asked the deputy coroner.

"The first name is Wenen——"

"Second name?"

Hesitation, sobbing, voices caused unmistakable confusion at the other end of the line, and then the receiver was suddenly hung up.

Mr. Jones at once transferred such information as he had received to the central police, and from the central station instruction was sent out to all the stations through whose precincts 55th street runs, bidding the commanding officers to search for the mysterious suicide.

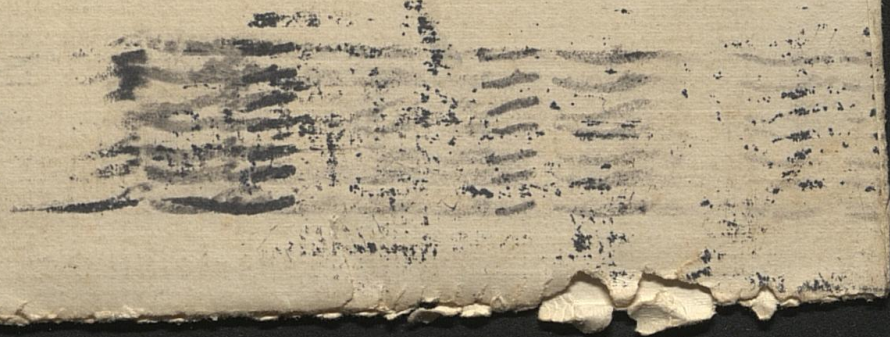

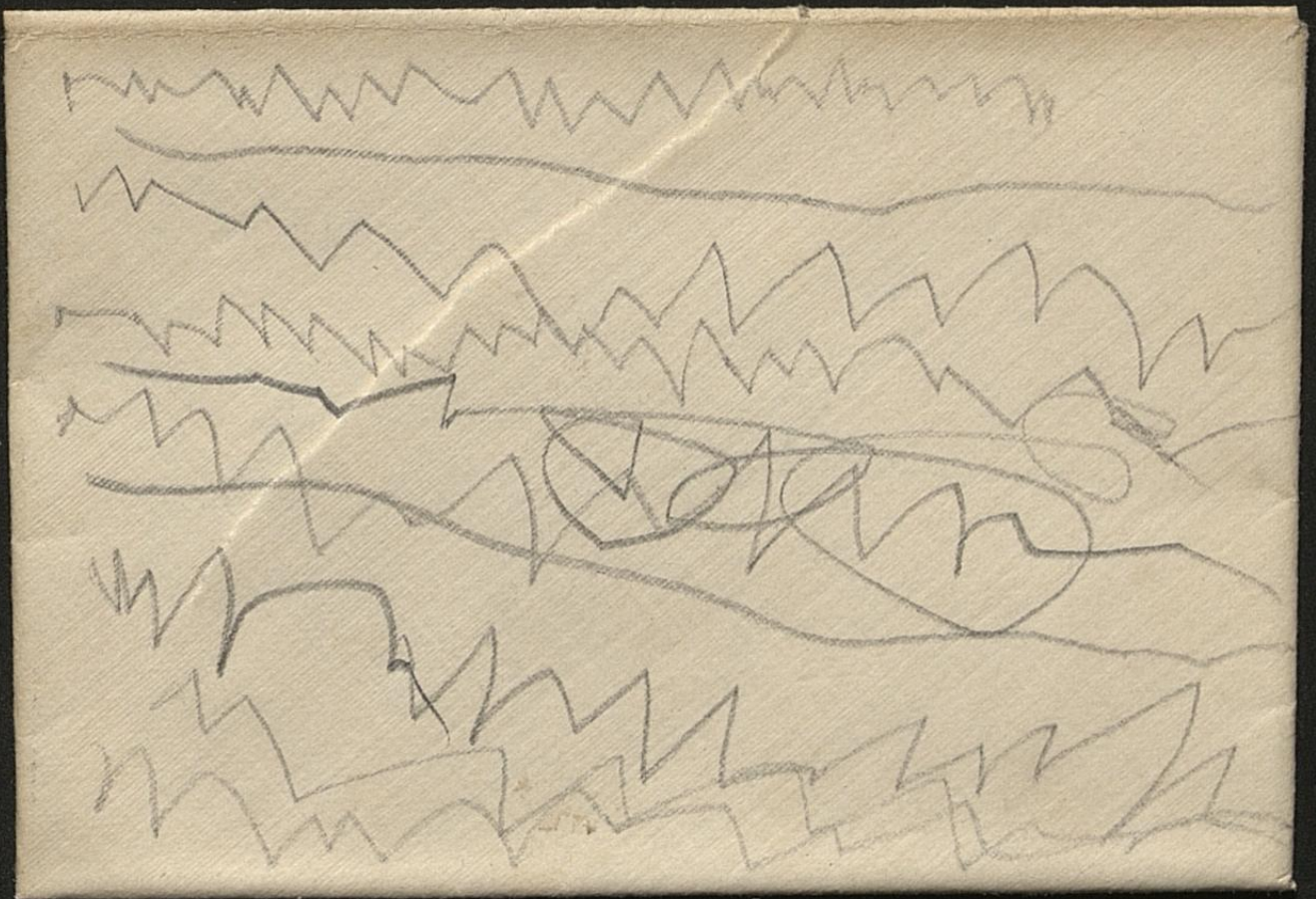
