

Classification of Yachts CLASS "A"

Yachts not exceeding thirty-eight feet over all length, and limited to five hundred feet total sail area.

CLASS "B"

Yachts not exceeding thirty-two feet over all length, and limited to three hundred and fifty square feet total sail area.

CLASS "C"

Yachts not exceeding twenty feet over all length, and limited to one sail of not over two hundred and twenty-five square feet area.

OPEN CLASSES

Yachts that cannot be classified according to the three above classes may be formed into separate classes upon application to the Regatta Committee, provided at least that three boats are entered.

Yachts to be eligible must be measured twenty-four hours before the time set for a race, unless the Regatta Committee gives written consent to

the contrary.

Arrangements to have yachts measured can be made with the Official Measurers. All owners of Power Boats are requested to send their entries to Chairman Power Boat Committee, so that time allowances may be arranged. Power Boats are to be handicapped on actual per-

formance. Pennants will be given to Boats finishing first in each class. Second prize pennants will be given provided at least three boats start. The winner of championship in "A" Class receives the Swift Cup, also the Commodore's Cup and a sweepstakes pennant. Winner of championship in "B" Class receives the M. Y. C. Cup and sweepstakes pennant. Winner of championship in "C" Class receives sweepstakes pennant. Championship will be sweepstakes pennant. awarded to boat in each Class having received the largest number of points at the season's close: boat finishing first to receive four points: 2nd, three points; 3rd, two points; 4th, one point.

A large turn-out is looked for the opening day, May 30th. The races are open to all boots on the Lake, Club Members and non members, and every one is cordially invited to place his boat in the

Season of 1908

To the Members:

Since 1881 the Minnetonka Yacht Club has been recognized as one of the leading yacht clubs in America. It has always been foremost in the development of that type of racing boat which has given to the Inland Lakes of the United States a world-wide reputation.

The coming season will be the most important in the history of the Club, especially as the championship races of the Inland Lake Yachting Association will be held under its auspices.

Every member is urged to assist in every way possible to enable the club to uphold its past reputation, and make the current season one long to be remembered.

The programs prepared by the several committees suggest the extensiveness of the work required.

Yachting

The Regatta Committee has arranged its schedule so that it will be possible to hold two series of trial races before August 1st; in this way it is believed they will be best able to select those boats which will represent the Club in the Inland Lake Championship races, and that the boats thus selected will be placed in better racing trim than during past years. A number of new boats have been added to the Club fleet.

Every boat owner is urged to have his boat in perfect condition for the first race, and for every subsequent race, each of which will be considered of equal importance towards furnishing data for the selection of representatives for the Inland Lake Championship Series.

Challenge Cups

The Swift Cup, contributed by Mr. Lucian Swift, will be awarded for one year to that boat which wins the championship in Class A, the name of the boat to be engraved upon the cup.

The Commodore's Cub, presented by Mr. Carl Puckett, will also be awarded for one year to that boat which wins the championship in Class A.

The M. Y. C. Cup, contributed by Messrs. R. M. Bennett and Fred'k Fayram, will be awarded for one year to the boat winning the championship in Class B, the name of the yacht to be engraved upon the cup.

The Janney Cup, contributed by Mr. T. B. Janney for the crew showing superiority in seamanship (conditions given later).

The Westman Cup, contributed by the Enterprise Machine Co. to the power boat winning the largest number of races during the season, will be held by the winner for one year.

The White Cup, contributed by the Globe Engine Works to the power boat making the fastest time in the races during the season, will be held by the winner for one year.

The Burton Cup will be raced for August 1st, under the following conditions:

First—The race to be open to all sloop rigged boats on Lake Minnetonka, the sail area of which is not less than 300 sq. feet., or does not exceed the maximum sail area permitted under the rules of the Club.

Second—Time allowance to be based on racing length, which length shall be determined by securing the square root of sail area.

Third—The racing length shall not be less than 19 feet.

Fourth—The course to be at least 10 knots in length.

Fifth—The name of the winning yacht, together with that of the owner, to be inscribed upon said cup.


