Der Sir.

I ow you an apology
for not writing ofner but having
nothing of much importance to inform
you of have neglected writing I received
your letter concerning cutting an halting
logs to Shildes Mill which I will comm-
ence as soon as the road gets so i can halt
there. & I believe your Uncle Will has enga-
ged the Irish to raise the dirt for your bricks
as you can see there in old wood. as we have
as much work on the farm, as we can get throu-
gh with in time for the plowing season. I have
bin very buisy cribing corn for the last ten
days I have upwards of four hundred barrels
in the cribs an there is near three hundred
in the fields yet i am getting eight barrels
where i did not expect to get five. I have
done but little in the wood line since Christmas
