Report for the Half-Session ending 31<sup>st</sup> Jan'y 1874

This report presents the average standing of the student for the entire half-session, with the result of the examination held at the end of the term, and the combination of the two, in equal ratio. Students who fall below the grade of 40 on the examination and 50 on the combined mark are considered DEFICIENT; those who obtain 60 on the examination, and 80 on the combined mark, are considered DISTINGUISHED. In examination for DEGREES, a minimum of 50 on the examination and 60 on the combined mark, is required for PROFICIENCY; and of 70 on the examination and 80 on the combined mark for DISTINGUISHED PROFICIENCY.
