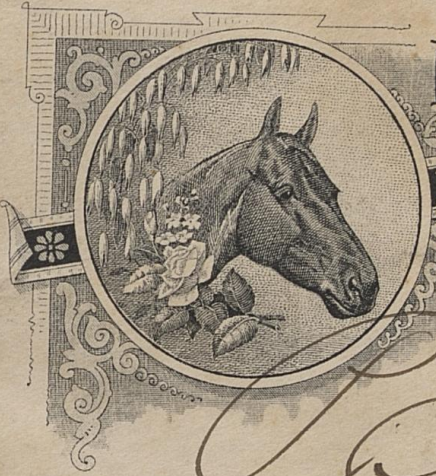

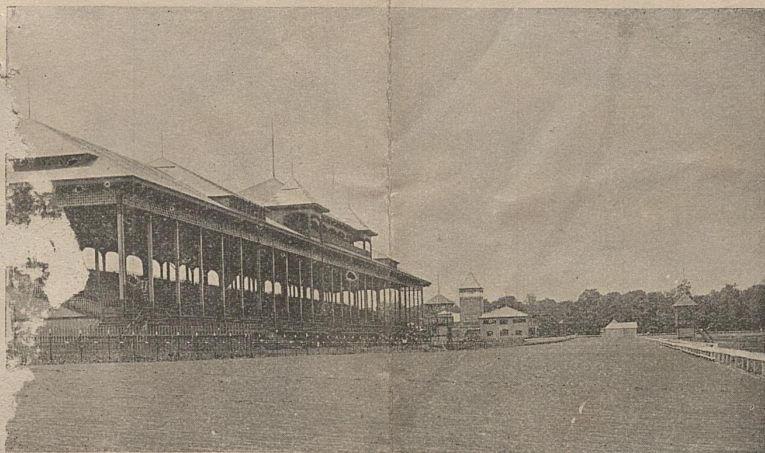

Fall Meeting, Sept. 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, 1894.

No. 1. STAKE \$600.—For trotting foals of 1892 eligible to 2:50 class. Entrance \$20; payable \$5 April 1st, when colts must be named; \$5 May 1st; \$5 June 1st; \$5 July 1st.

No. 2. STAKE \$600.—For pacing foals of 1892, eligible to 2:45 class. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 1. Here is your chance. Only \$5 to name your colt.

No. 3. STAKE \$1,000.—For three-year-old trotters, eligible to 2:40 class. Entrance \$50, payable \$12.50 April 1st, when horses must be named; \$12.50 May 1st; \$12.50 June 1st; \$12.50 July 1st.

No. 4. STAKE \$1,000.—For three-year-old pacers eligible to 2:35 class. Entrance \$50. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 3.

No. 5. STAKE \$1,000.—For trotters eligible to 2:30 class. Entrance \$50. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 3.

No. 6. STAKE \$1,000.—For pacers eligible to 2:25 class. Entrance \$50. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 3.

No. 7. STAKE \$1,000.—For trotters eligible to 2:21 class. Entrance \$50. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 3.

No. 8. STAKE \$1,000.—For pacers eligible to 2:20 class. Entrance \$50. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 3.

No. 9. STAKE \$1,000.—For trotters eligible to 2:18 class. Entrance \$50. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 3.

No. 10. STAKE \$1,000.—For pacers eligible to 2:15 class. Entrance \$50. Payments and conditions same as Stake No. 3.

Grand Hotel Stake No. 11. \$3,000.—For trotters eligible to 2:10 class. Entrance \$150. Payments, \$37.50 April 1st; \$37.50 May 1st; \$37.50 June 1st; \$37.50 July 1st.

CONDITIONS.—Entries to stakes close April 1st. Entrance as above with 5 per cent. additional from all winners. Mile heat, best three in five except stakes Nos. 1 and 2, which will be mile heats best two in three. Money in all stakes divided 50, 25, 15 and 10 per cent. All stakes for face value only. American Trotting Association Rules to govern. First money only to horse distancing field or walkovers. Right reserved to refund payments on stakes that do not fill to the satisfaction of the Club. No entry liable for more than amount paid in, but a non-payment forfeits previous payments. No return of payment on account of death of entry. Right reserved to change order of program. Usual weather clause. Nominators must give name, color, sex and breeding. Purse events will be announced later and will be as liberal as the best of them. Get your entries for stakes ready.
