The Inventory of Federal Archives in the States is one of the products of the work of the Survey of Federal Archives, which operated as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration from January 1, 1936 to June 30, 1937, and has been continued since that date as a unit of the Historical Records Survey, also operating as a nation-wide project of the Works Progress Administration, and a

group of state or local projects of that Administration. The plan for the organization of the Inventory is as follows: Series I consists of reports on the administration of the Survey, acknowledgments, and general discussions of the location, condition, and content of federal archives in the states. Succeeding series contain the detailed information secured by workers of the Survey, in inventory form, a separate series number being assigned to each of the executive departments (except the Department of State) and other major units of the Federal Government. Within each series No. 1 is a general introduction to the field organization and records of the governmental agency concerned; the succeeding numbers contain the inventory proper, separate numbers being assigned to each state in alphabetical order. Thus, in each series, the inventory for Alabama is No. 2,

that for Arizona No. 3, that for Arkansas No. 4, etc. For each local office information regarding each series, or unit of related records, is presented in the following order: title, inclusive dates ("to date" indicating an open file at the time the information was secured), general description of informational content, description of the system of filing or indexing (if any), a statement of frequency and purpose of use, form of the record itself (bound volumes, sheets in folders, etc.), linear footage, description of the containers, physical condition of the records (not stated if satisfactory), location by room number or other identifying information, and finally, the number of the Form 58SA on which this information was originally recorded by a Survey worker and from which it was abstracted for the Inventory. This form is on file in the National Archives. When it contains substantial information on addenda sheets which has not been included in the mimeographed abstract, indication of this is given by use of the reference "See addenda."

In Arizona the work of the Survey was directed by Professor Howard A. Hubbard of the University of Arizona, with Mrs. Meryl E. Morgan as his assistant, until June 30, 1937. Since that date the state project has been directed by Mrs. Morgan. This inventory of the records of the federal courts in Arizona was prepared in the Tucson office of the Survey, with Mr. R. W. Langworthy as chief editor. It was edited before final typing by Dr. G. Philip Bauer of the Division of Research, The National Archives.

During the period following the acquisition of Arizona north of the Gila River in 1846, and south of that river in 1854, while the territory was nominally a part of New Mexico, there do not appear to have been any courts of record in the territory. In fact, on June 8, 1862, Col. James H. Carlton, 1st California Volunteers, issued a proclamation, at Tucson, declaring himself Military Governor of the Territory of Arizona "until such time as a Civil Government is established. The original proclamation written in long hand on a double sheet of ruled foolscap is now in the Arizona Pioneers! Historical Society at Tucson. The Organic Act of the Territory of Arizona, approved February 24, 1863, provided "the Judicial power shall be vested in a Supreme Court, to consist of three judges. who ... shall be appointed by the President, by and with the advice of the Senate." In 1864 the territory was divided into three Judicial Districts and the following Judges appointed:

Wm. F. Turner, Chief Justice Henry T. Backus, Associate Justice Joseph P. Alleys, Associate Justice

These Judges were assigned to the three districts and held terms of both United States and Territorial district courts in the several county seats within their districts. Periodically they met at the capitol and held terms of the Territorial Supreme Court. ... the justice from whose district a case was appealed not sitting with the court in the consideration of that particular case.

The United States courts for the Territory were originally divided into three districts, comprising the four original counties. As new counties were created the Territory was redistricted from time to time. The chronology of such jurisdictional changes arranged by districts and counties, follows:

The present United States court for the district of Arizona came into being with statehood, February 14, 1912, with one district judge, residing at Tucson, who held regular terms of court in Tucson, Globe, Phoenix, and Prescott. In 1922 the district was divided into two divisions with a judge at Phoenix who also held the Prescott term. The clerk of the court and United States marshal are located in Tucson, the residence of the senior judge with deputies in the other cities named. The Tucson division now comprises the counties of Pima, Santa Cruz, Cochise, Gila, and Greenlee, with terms of court held in Tucson and Globe. The clerk's records were stored in rented quarters prior to the construction of the Post Office and Court House and the steel filing cases are infested with cockroaches which the clerk has been unable to exterminate with the funds at his disposal.

### TERRITORIAL COURTS

## UNITED STATES COURTS FOR THE TERRITORY

#### PHOENIX

Old Federal Bldg., N. First and Van Buren Sts.

There were no United States courthouses in the territory. Terms of the United States court were held in the several county courthouses, and the records were lodged with the clerks of these county courts. Upon the admission of the state in 1912, the records and files of the United States courts were ordered shipped to Phoenix and are now stored in the basement of the Old Federal Building in that city. A few scattering records were retained by and are now in the custody of the clerks of the superior courts of the counties.
