The following recommendations of the Committee on Duplication of Courses were approved:

- ✓ Art 17a, b - Art: Appréciation - 1 credit
- ↓ Political Science 173 - Public Opinion - changed from 2 credits to 3 credits and a new number assigned. *172 assigned.*
- ↓ History 105 - Colonial America - 3 credits
- ↓ Physics 250a, b - Relativity. 3 credits
- ↓ Mathematics 119 - Modern Geometry - 3 credits
- ↓ Journalism 105 - Law of the Press - 3 credits
- ↓ Journalism 107 - Editorial Writing - 3 credits

The above two courses to replace Journalism 105a, Law of the Press and Editorial Writing.

- ↓ Geology 12 - Elementary Geology for Engineers - 2 recitations, one laboratory a week. 3 credits.

Senate approved the recommendation of the University Council that permission be granted for the organization of a club, the name to be selected later. The purpose of the club is to combine social life with scholarship and the members are to be required to have a standing above the average. Membership is not open to freshmen.

Dean Cooper read the following letter from Dr. John R. Sampey, Acting President of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary:
