# Parkinson's treatment created at UK

**Testing:** Researchers say new treatment could slow progress of disease for many

Researchers at UK have begun a clinical trial of a new treatment that could end up helping the thousands of peoli, ationwide afflicted with Parkinson's disease.

The cause of Parkinson's is unknown, and current treat:

Slevin is part of a four-man research team administering the trial. Other members include Dr. Greg Gerhardt and Dr. Don Gash, both professors in the department of anatomy and neurobiology, and Byron Young, chief of staff for the UK Hospital.

tremors and slow movement), roughly 75 percent of their dopamine neurons are not working. Not all these neurons are dead; some are merely injured, Slevin said.
Research done previously by Gerhardt and Gash found that a chemical known as glial cell line-derived neurotrophic factor (GNDP) both protects the neurons and promotes the reseneration of injured ones.

This means that treatment using GNDF could reverse some of the signs and symp-

toms of Parkinson's and help patients function better. Slevin said. The new treatment will use a surgically implanted pump to administer GDNF directly into a patient's brain.

"This (treatment) promises to change the course of Parkinson's disease," Gash said.
The clinical trial is what is known as a Phase I in which researchers are primarily studying the safety of the treatment on humans.



## **Ex-girlfriend's testimony:** Ragland confessed murder

On the stand: Star witness says Ragland admitted he murdered UK football player

LEXINGTON — The former girlfriend of a man accused in the sniper-style slaying of a UK football player told a jury Monday that he told her he was the killer.

Almee Lloyd is considered the star witness for the prosecution, which says that Shane Ragland killed Trent DiGiuro in retaliation for getting hin blackballed from the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity.

DiGiuro was killed when a
bullet slammed into his temple
as he celebrated his 21st birthday with friends on the porch of
his home on July 17, 1994.

The crime went unsolved for half a decade until Lloyd came forward in January 2000 and told police that Ragland told her while they were dating that he shot and killed the walk-on offensive lineman and jerk, just an awful person,"

Lloyd testified that she and Ragland, now 28, began dating in the winter of 1994 and that the relationship lasted more than a year.
She told the jury that Ragland told her during a night of drinking in the spring of 1995 that he pedaled to DiGiuro's house on a blike, took out a rifle and shot DiGiuro.
"As hard as I'we tried not to

"As hard as I've tried not to remember this, he asked me if I remembered the football player who had been killed," she said. "He told me his name, Trent, and told me that he shot him, that he was the one that killed him.



# SG's expenses need clearer explanation

It just wouldn't be March Madness without a little Student Government controver It just wouldn't be March Madness without a little Student Government controversty. SG President Tim Robinson claims that all expenditures made by his administration can be documented, but documentation alone does not justify spending the money in the first place.

It is not a question of corruption, so far as anyone can tell, but simply a knee Jerk reaction to spend what is there to spend — call it politicianitis. Under Jimmy Glenn, the annual budget for SG was \$142,000, and Glenn ran a deficit of \$10,000. Under Robinson, the budget ballooned to \$203,000, and all but \$17 was spent.

And if the SG grew to \$10 million next year, chances are all of it would be spent somehow. It is the nature of the beast when people are charged with spending money that is not theirs and they cannot keep.

But it is a practice that should be examined and criticized. SG received a 43 percent increase in funding between last year and this year, and the manner in which those funds were put to use merits an explanation.

The largest portion went to operating expenses — salaries, office expenses, etc.

The largest portion went to operating expenses — salaries, office expenses, etc. — which saw an increase of more than 80 percent from the previous year. The staffs of both the president and the vice president both increased substantially as well, which begs the question: Why does the SG vice president have a staff?

Judgment should be reserved until Robinson has a chance to explain the spending. For example, why members of his administration all need new palm pilots and why renovating the SG office cost \$18,000, when the carpeting was donated and the computers came from UK (which is also funded by students, meaning SG is costing students even more more). even more money)

It is simply not enough to say that all expenses can be documented when those ex

It is simply not enough to say that all expenses can be documented when those expenses shouldn't have been made in the first place. If there is money left over after all necessary expenditures have been made, set it aside and decrease the student fee.

Or just provide an explanation as to why SG costs so much more to run this year than the last. In fact, now would be the perfect time for answers, what with the upcoming SG election and all ....


