NEWBERRY LIBRARY CENTER FOR RENAISSANCE STUDIES 1983 SUMMER INSTITUTE

The Newberry Library Center for Renaissance Studies is pleased to announce its 1983 Summer Institute in the Archival Sciences, which will be led by Professor Armando Petrucci, Director of the Institute of Paleography, the University of Rome. Assisted by Professor Franca Nardelli, Dr. Petrucci will provide intensive training in the reading, transcribing, and editing of Italian vernacular manuscripts. (1300-1650). He will also offer a thorough orientation in the organization of Italian archives, libraries, and manuscript collections. The course, which will run from June 20 to July 30, 1983, will be conducted in Italian.

Stipends (up to \$2000) from the National Endowment for the Humanities are available for full-time faculty members employed in institutions of higher learning in the United States, including university librarians with instructional responsibilities. Participants' home institutions, unless affiliated with the Center for Renaissance Studies or the Folger Institute, are expected to pay a \$200.00 registration fee. (This is a cost-sharing requirement of the granting agency.) Application forms are available at OSPA/UKRF. The application deadline is March 15, 1983.
