December 11th

The Faculty met at the call of Drs. Patterson, who stated the object of the meeting to be to take some action in regard to a statement made in the "Minority report" concerning Regent Bowman's character. The members present were Drs. Patterson, Prof. Deter, Shackelford, and H. B. Smith, Col. Swigert, and Adj. Prof. White. A preamble and resolution were then offered which after a few slight modifications in the language read as follows: "On page 76 of the Minority address, lately published, the first sentence of the second reason section of reason No. 2, petitioning the removal of Regent Bowman, reads as follows. 'Should any member of the Faculty venture to differ with him and dare to oppose his general plans and purposes he becomes the subject of attack and persecution.' Whereas the language above quoted is general and equally applicable to each of the five Faculties of Kentucky University, and whereas the general statement involves us, the Faculty of the A. and M. College, equally with the other Faculties, Therefore Resolved that the language above quoted entirely misrepresents the relations hitherto existing between Regent Bowman and the Faculty of this College, and that nothing has occurred to warrant or justify the statement in question." After reading the preamble and resolution as first read written Prof. Deter

was excused in order to hear his class; he having stated that unless the preamble and resolution were materially altered he would vote for them. All the other members voted for the preamble and resolution. The Secretary was directed to send a copy of the preamble and resolution to the presiding officers of each of the other Colleges of N.Y. University.

On motion the Faculty adjourned.

Permission was given Mr. Mercer to leave the labor department.
