UK FIRST AMENDMENT CENTER

The First Amendment Center at the University of Kentucky, located in the Communications Reading Room in the Enoch Grehan Journalism Building, was established in April, 1987, by a grant from the Kentucky First Amendment Congress, a nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting First Amendment Rights, and the Kentucky Post.

Additional funding for the Center has come from grants given by the Scripps Howard Foundation, Ashland Oil, the Gannett Foundation, the Kentucky Press Association, Ottaway Newspapers, the Paducah Sun, the law firm of Deters, Benzinger and LaVelle, the Owensboro Messenger-Inquirer and others. The funds are being used to purchase books, periodicals, videotapes, films and slides for the collection and to establish an endowment to insure continuation of the Center.

According to Roy L. Moore, an associate professor in UK's School of Journalism who is director of the Center, "more than \$3,000 has already been spent to buy a variety of materials for the Center, which promises to be the only one of its kind in the country."

"Most of the materials have already been catalogued, and they represent some of the best works available about the First Amendment," says Ruby Herald, Communications Librarian. "We also now have videotapes on the First Amendment and even the original entries from the prestigious E.W. Scripps First Amendment contests."

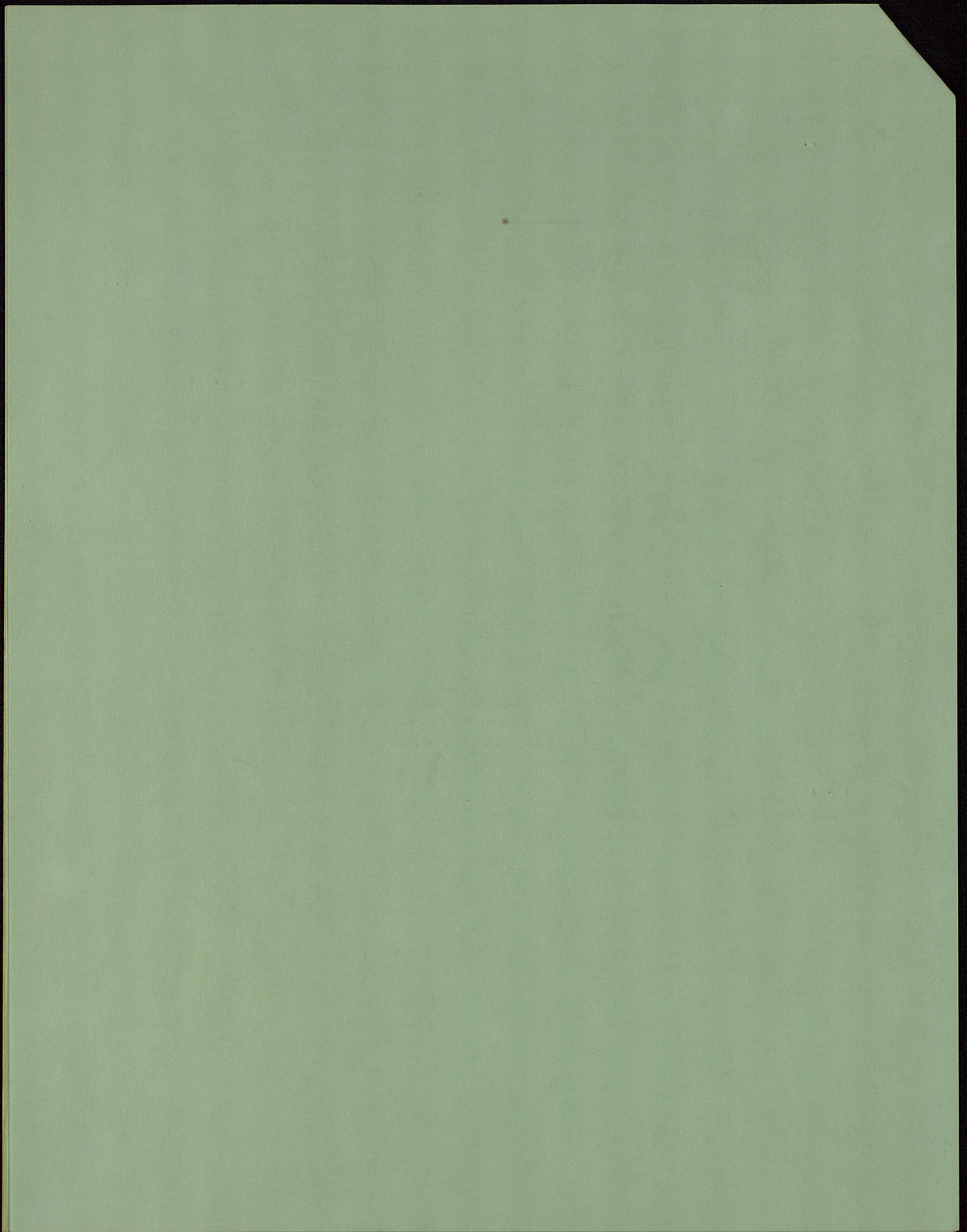
