

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE

October 13, 1924

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, October 13 at 3:45 p. m., Dean Boyd presiding.

The minutes of August 13 were read and approved.

The recommendation of the Rules Committee in regard to cheating in University work was read and after some modification was adopted as follows:

Rules.
"All cases of cheating shall be reported to the head of the department in which the cheating occurs, who shall immediately investigate the circumstances and in conference with the members of his department, determine the guilt or innocence of the student charged. If the student is adjudged guilty, he shall be dropped from the class in which the cheating occurs with a grade of E. This decision shall be final.

"This action is to be reported in writing by the head of the department to the student's dean and to the Registrar who shall certify on the student's record: "Dropped with grade of E".

"It shall be the duty of the Registrar to notify the dean of men or dean of women, who shall acquaint the parent or guardian of the student and the student of the fact of the record, and to inform the student of the penalty in case he is dropped from class as a second offense.

"If a student is dropped from class for cheating as a second offense he shall be suspended for one year. The Registrar shall report that fact to his dean, who will notify the student that he is suspended."

The Senate requested the Registrar to furnish the Kernel a copy of the above resolution for publication and to send a copy to each student in the University through the mail.

The following recommendation from the Chapel Exercises Committee was approved:

"That the Freshman Convocation held on Tuesdays at the fifth hour be abolished; and that a general convocation of all classes and faculty be held once each month during the school year.

"Also that vesper services be arranged for on Sunday afternoon at four o'clock".

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

In the course in industrial chemistry, physics 3a and 5 the first semester and 3b and 6 the second semester to take the place of physics

2a and 2b. With the approval of the Council this change has been inaugurated this fall.

In the same course, physics 110 to be omitted in the senior year.

✓ Chemistry 5a and b to be replaced by a new course, chemistry 150 Advanced Inorganic chemistry, four credits.

✓ Make the following changes in chemistry numbers: chem. 9 change to 109; chem. 12 to 112; 13a and b to 113a and b; 14 to 114.

✓ ~~Psychology 7, Psychology of the Child - DEAN Boyd's letter - 3/7/27~~
Psychology 8, Child Psychology. Pre-requisite and introductory course in psychology. Three recitations per week.

The course has been requested by the Department of Home Economics to follow course 10 which its students are taking this semester.

✓ To adopt A. L. 4a and 4b. Selections from Ovid and Virgil. 3 credits per semester.

To change all numbers in courses in A. L. above 6 to courses with numbers above 100 as follows:

- ✓ Ancient Language 7, Tacitus, to A. L. 107
- ✓ " " 8, Terrence (Phormio); Pliny's Letters to A. L. 108
- ✓ " " 9, Latin Literature (Selections) to A. L. 109
- ✓ " " 10, Suetonius, Seneca, to A. L. 110
- ✓ " " 12a and b Latin Composition, to A. L. 112a and b
- ✓ " " 53, Homer, to A. L. 153
- ✓ " " 54, Plato, to A. L. 154
- ✓ " " 55, Heroditus, to A. L. 155

Credits remain as before.

✓ The present course in Political Science 55, entitled, "Comparative Government", to be expanded to a year course, 155a and b, three credits for semester.

✓ To change Legislative Drafting from 75a and b to 175a and b, thus making it available for seniors and graduates. One credit for semester.

✓ Botany 10a and b to be succeeded by 125a and b, Morphology of Fungi, thus making the course open to graduate students. 4 credits for semester.

The following recommendations from the College of Agriculture were approved:

✓ Change A. I. 3, Advanced Poultry Production, two lectures, two laboratory periods, to A. I. 112, three lectures, 1 laboratory period.

✓ Change Farm Economics 9, Cooperative Marketing, 3 credits, to Farm Economics 109, three credits.

✓ Change Farm Economics 105, Advanced Marketing, two credits, to farm Economics 110, three credits.

✓ Add Farm Economics 201a and b, Research in Marketing and Cooperation, for graduate students. Three credits each semester.

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The following recommendations from the College of Education were approved:

✓ Education 215a and 215b to be raised from three to six credits each and the numbers changed to 221a and 221b.

It was also recommended that the College of Education offer a course in The Psychology of Childhood. This was referred to a committee to be appointed by the President.

Professors W. S. Webb and George Roberts were elected Senate representatives in the University Council.

Senate approved the request of the Alpha Gamma Rho fraternity to be allowed to petition a national fraternity.
