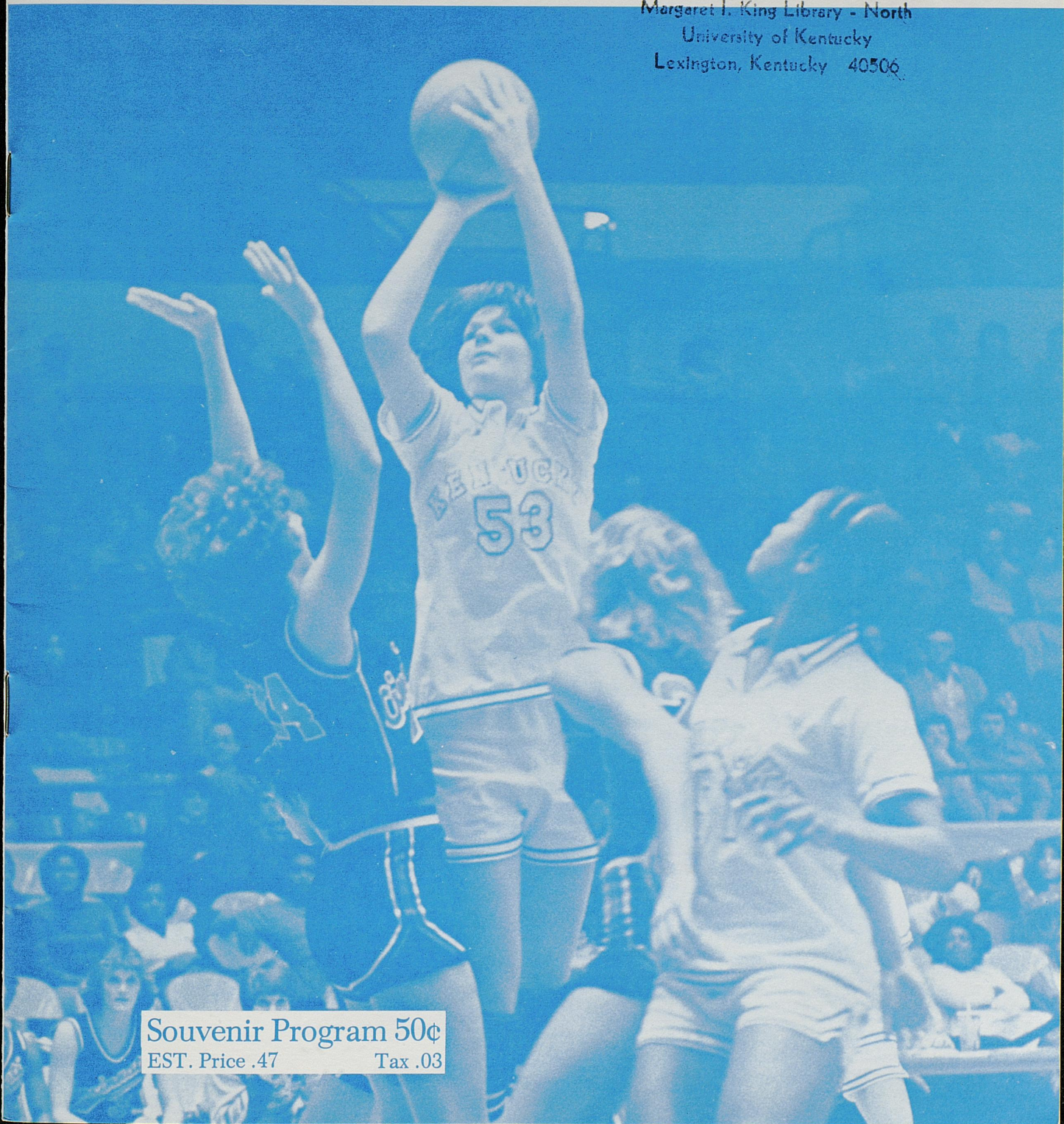

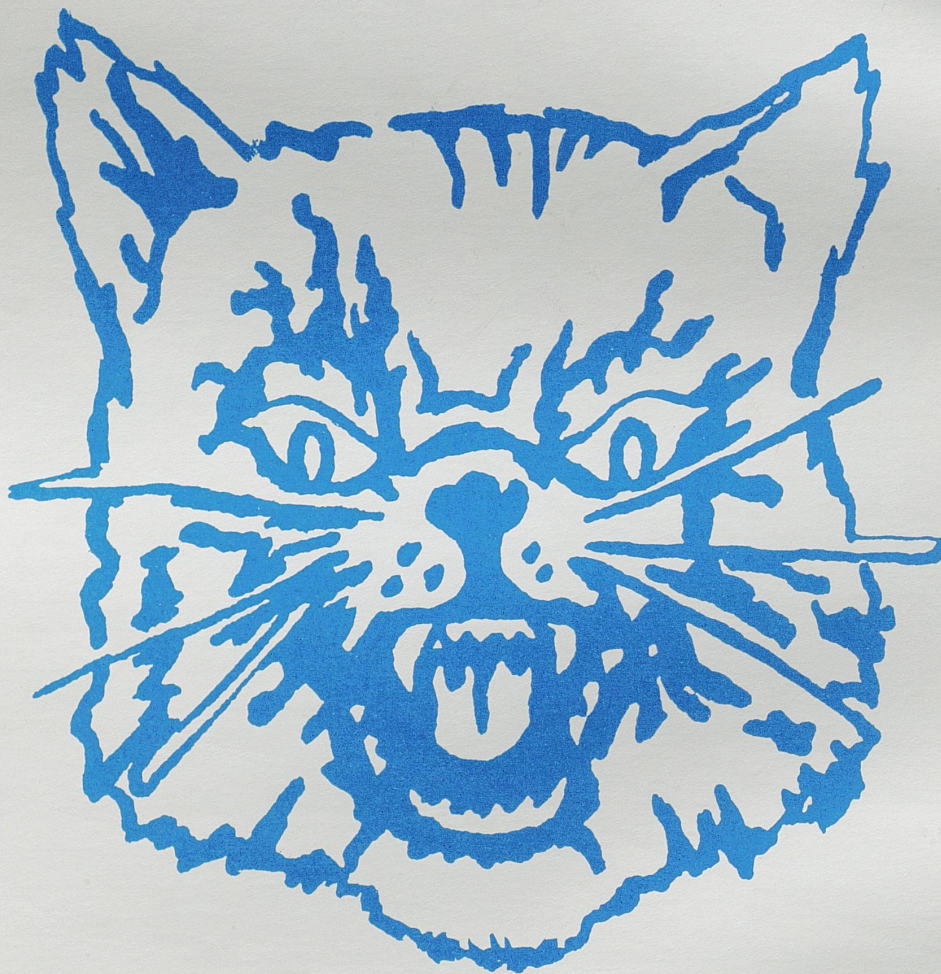

Kentucky Athletics

Serving Varied Interests Of Student Body

University level sports are divided into three divisions ranging from varsity men's football and basketball in Division I to less revenue producing sports.

At the University of Kentucky, an effort is made to accommodate the varied interests of the student body by providing collegiate level competitive teams in numerous sports activities.

Scholarships are offered in all of the University's Division III sports, creating a large amount of financial help for numerous students with talents in many specialized endeavors.

The divisions are roughly defined as Division I, which generates revenue and is self-supporting; Division II which is on the verge of being self-supporting and Division III, which is not income producing.

The coaching staffs for Division III sports are generally part-time coaches with the exception at UK of coaches for wrestling, and swimming.

Women's basketball is in Division II which carries a five-year goal for achieving the self-sufficiency of Division I.

Women's basketball comes under the guidance of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), the counterpart to the men's NCAA. The U.S. is divided into nine regions with UK in the Southern Region along with North and South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia. Competition begins on the state level with all college teams involved, then goes to Region, and finally national.

III sports activities. "By providing a chance for these young people to participate competitively in their fields of expertise, the University is able to provide financial help for a large number of talented individuals and is able to further serve the needs of its student body," she comments.

Continuing, Feamster states that the Athletic Department is extremely proud of the excellent record of achievements that has been accomplished by Division III teams. "It is a tribute to the dedication of these fine athletes and their coaches," she said.

Since athletic teams other than Division I do not attract a large amount of media attention, their coaches are seldom publicly recognized for the contributions that they make to the lives of their participants. Therefore, the University would like to take this opportunity to identify these dedicated individuals.
