Dear Mom and Father,

Such was the case last week - with the Tylers arrival I kind of dropped everything. We were thrilled to see them and things finally worked out so we could all get together. I picked Coogie up Tues. morning and brought her back here - she insisted on hanging up my wash so Jessie and I wouldn't "talk about her" being a bad guest! Betty Roe came over for lunch, and then at the last minute things worked out for the Tylers, Mr. Casleman, John & Jess, and Bob and me to all have dinner -

which was great fun. We went to a very fancy place - great food, Wzd. Coogie and I went over to Betty's for lunch and had a nice time chatting. It really was a boost to see them and talk of familiar things.

I've been having a girl come to work on Thursdays, and so far so good. She cleans well, irons beautifully, and is good with the boys. So I do hope it works out since I don't get out much.

Friday night the Castlemans had us over to meet some of their friends - very nice, but per usual - a little out of our league - the big problem seemed to be how much to pay the yard man! Jess' nurse has gone now, and although she has a maid every day, it is still difficult to manage with the twins. They are really beautiful babies, but two just is a problem. I go over when I

Speaking of people being out of our league, I think (at least I hope) you will be proud of us in our decision NOT to even try to keep up with these people. We can't anyway, so there's no sense getting involved. 


