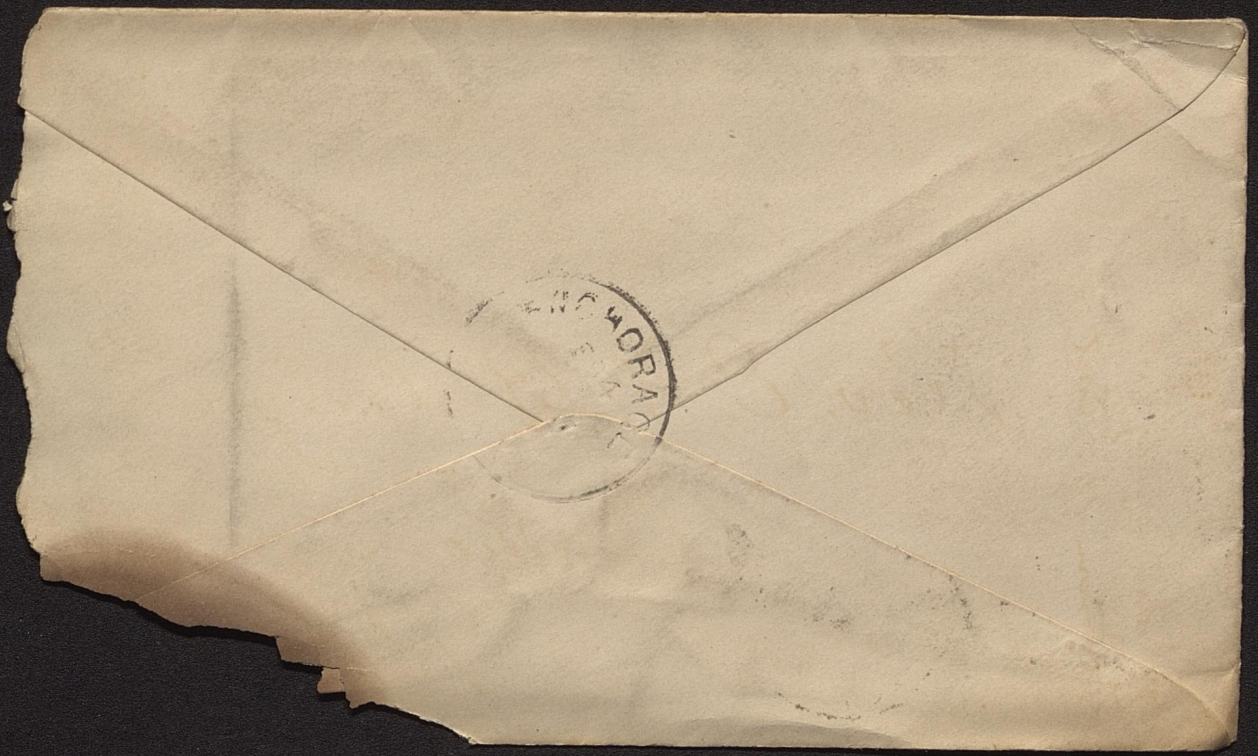

Dear Sir

I have delayed answering your last letter, hoping to find out price of the lot I spoke of, I saw the agent and he said they had not heard from the lady whether she would take the price they had set on the lot, \$2,00 for the whole, and he could not tell what the corner would be worth till they heard from her again, I fear we will not be able to get it, as it is one of the prettiest building sites in Murray, and others want it I hear, I was so in hope you would come out when you were at Freebytery & see about it, I write now in behalf of the Hueden church, I have just been there and the men that have the money collected say if it is not used very soon

They will return it to the one by whom
it was given, our elder & deacon see both
new members to the church, and do not
know how to proceed without orders,
they have no plan for the church and
no authority to begin the work, I heard
they had about 4800 collected there with
the promise of more when it was begun
the deacon had written Dr. Spencer but
had no answer, they asked me to write
you as I was acquainted with you
the Methodists have the lumber on the
ground to begin there, and the Baptists
are going to build one, or Mr. Irvine
says he will build them one worth
41000, I was so in hopes one would be
first, if you can give them any definite
information how to proceed, please
write to Mr. Faircloth, the elder and
tell them what to do, as they see only
wanting orders, I hope you will do so
soon, as they are anxious to begin work

They were so pleased with Bro. Allens
and so desirous to give him up, so were
we with Bro. Bingham, and wanted
to know if there was any prospect of
our having another minister soon,
I told them I did not know was in
hope we would have one soon,
Mr. King acts very strangely, does not
come to our meetings at all, goes all
the time to the Campbellite church
I wish he would withdraw, Dr. Lane
wanted me to ask him to do so
but I did not feel like I was the
one to do it, I think he is doing us
much injury by acting as he does
Dr. Brents commences a meeting here
1st July, I suppose he will join them
I wish we had the power to put him
out, he has acted so strangely.

We have had a great deal of measles
here, and several deaths from it
run into Pneumonia or Bronchitis
Bro Bell the Methodist minister lost
3 children in less than two weeks, left
yesterday with the last one, for his
home near Hollow Rock, he has the
sympathy of the entire community, he
had 4 sons and two daughters, he lost
his oldest daughter, and two youngest
sons, it was distressing to be there,
I hope you will be able to come to see
us soon, Dr Knigely promised to
come after the holidays, but he has
not been yet, I was so in hope Dr
Spence would come, he said he would
but he has not been yet, I do hope
we will soon have another minister
hoping soon to hear from you
