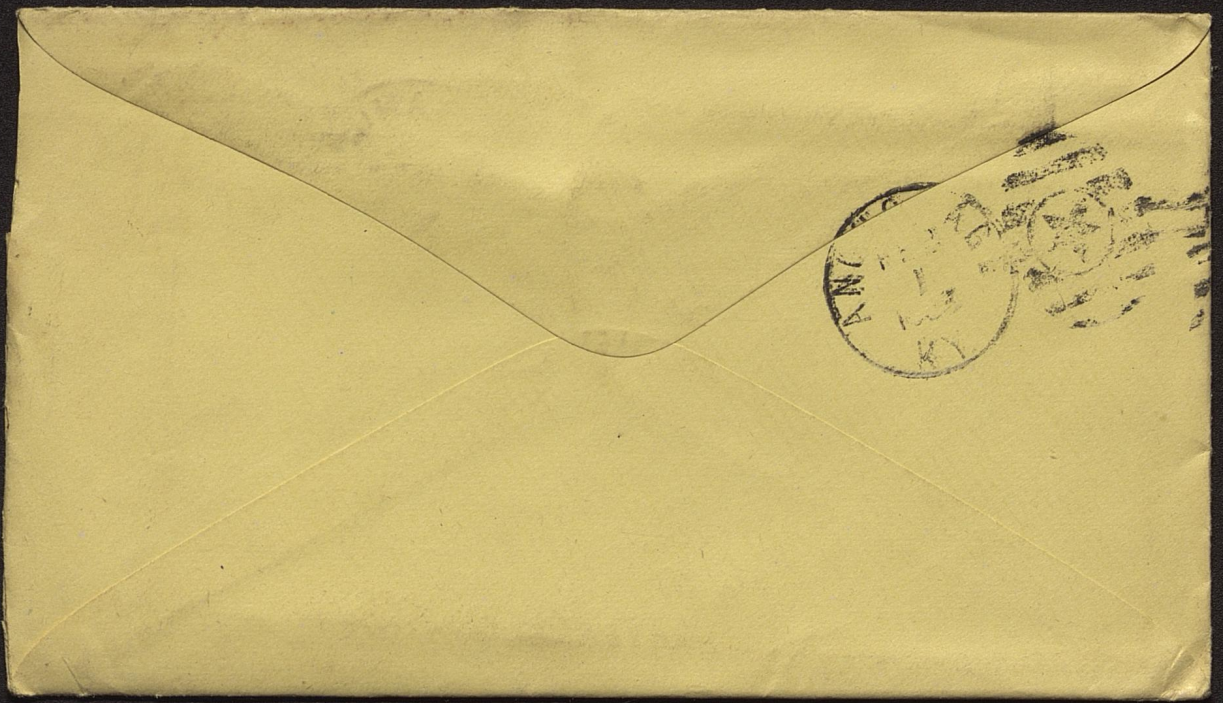

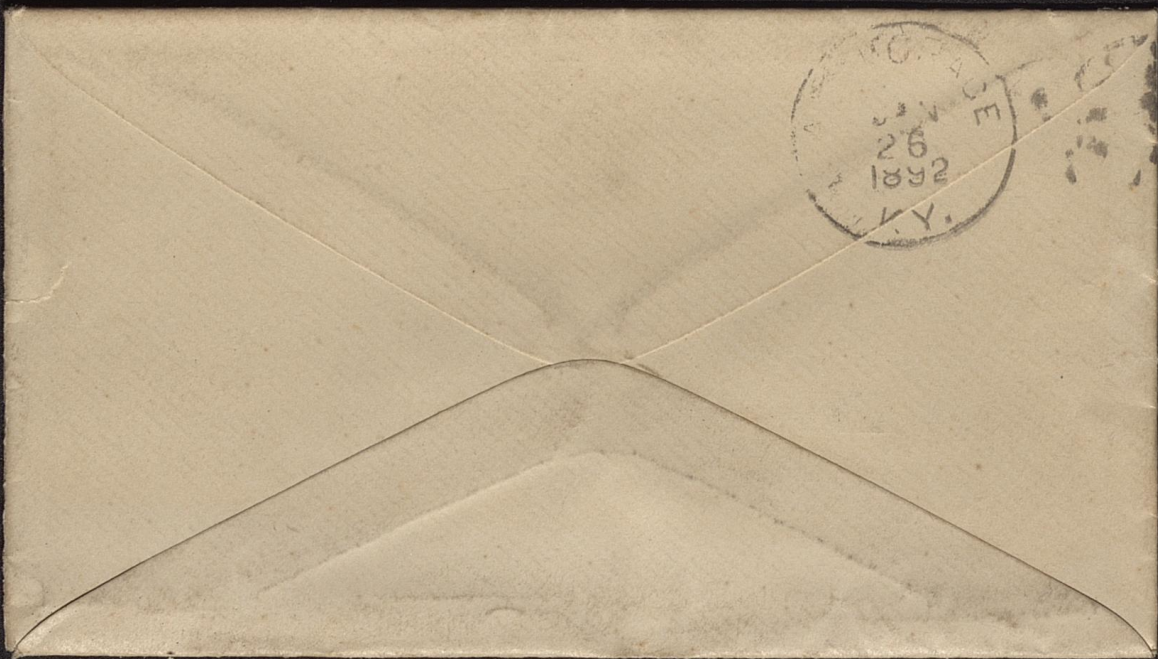

Christian sympathy so kindly expressed.

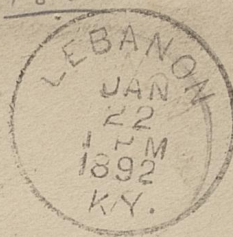
The Master has no where taught

Dear Dr. Beaman
