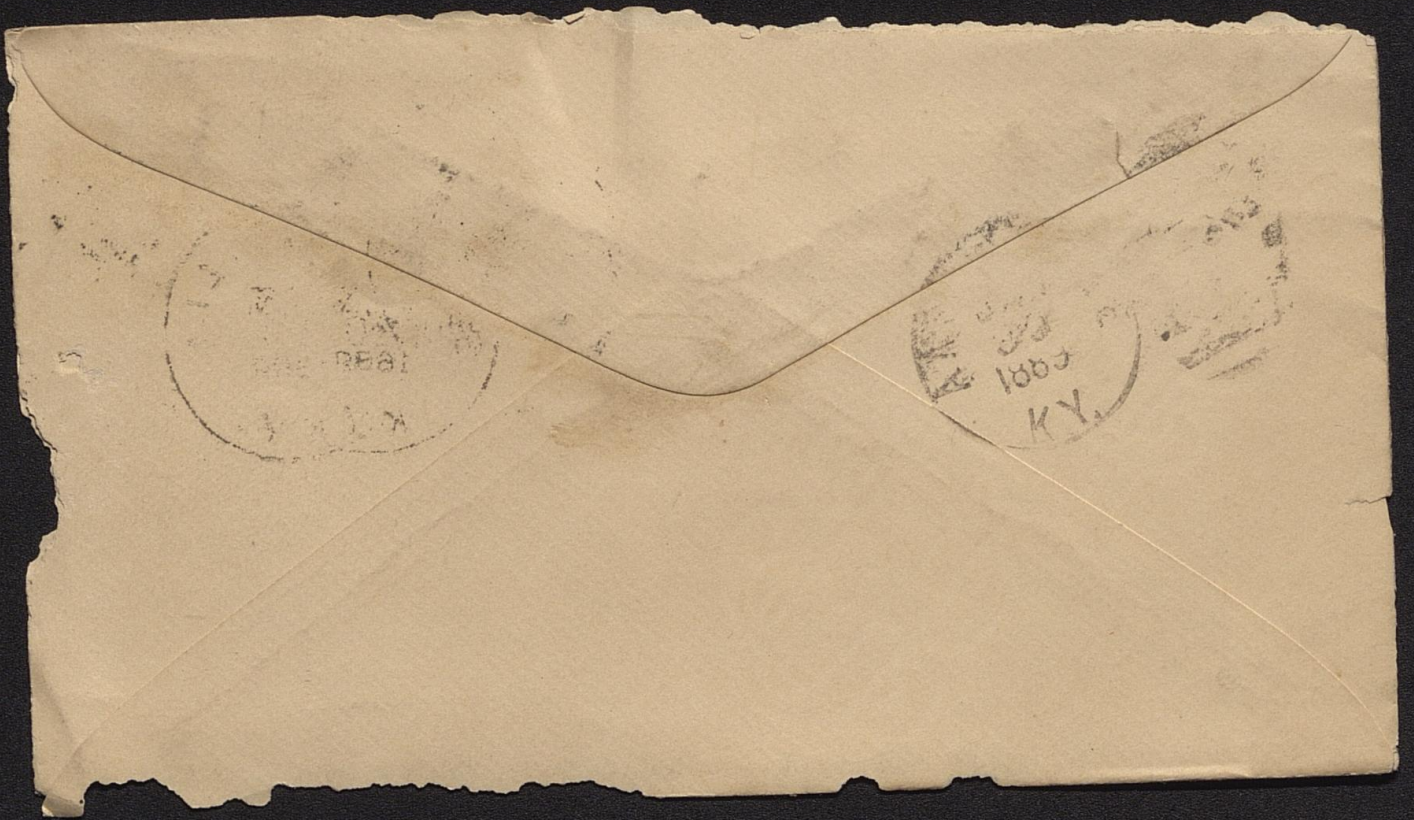

Yours of Dec. 25/88  
just received - I had not  
noticed the 8<sup>th</sup> resolution

At Ridgewood we are still  
making arrangements  
to build in the spring -  
Sunday schools have been

well kept up - especially  
at Ridgewood, where it  
has been much better  
than ever before - &  
I think Ridgewood & Uniontown  
are growing, tho'  
slowly -

Report of Rev W. A. Miley  
Mission

Corydon Ky,  
July 1st 1841

Rev. S. W. Bedinger,  
Anchorage, Ky.

My dear sir & bro.

I suppose you were very much surprised that I declined the call to Carrollton, as some of the members of my own pres. seem to be - well, I of course see, at once, that that is a more promising & more desirable field, in every respect, than the one I am now in.

but I could not see  
just what was to become  
of this field - as I believe,  
I told you when I saw  
you, it is a very hard  
& discouraging field, es-  
pecially Ridgewood -  
The church there seemed  
to be completely dead, we  
have a membership of  
87 - but they had never  
done any thing & it seem-  
ed impossible to get them  
to do any thing & yet it  
did look like a pity to  
drop a church of so large  
a membership - I was  
fuzzled to know just  
what ought to be done -  
So I determined to stay  
a while longer & make  
an earnest effort either  
to make or break - & I be-  
lieve the Master guided

me in it all - & now I  
want to give you some  
encouraging facts in  
regard to Ridgewood -  
Some recent developments,  
which, though small in  
themselves, I think in-  
dicate a return to life, &  
hope are the beginning  
of a lively growth -  
Since the close of my first  
year (June 1st) they have  
paid up all of my back  
salary, except a few dol-  
lars, & the session assures  
me that will be ready  
next week - They pro-  
mise to give toward my sup-  
port, this coming year,  
\$300<sup>00</sup> - This seems a small  
matter, but when we re-  
member that the contri-

Attention toward my support last year was made up by Bros. Evans & Hopper at the close of their meeting there, when the whole community was wrought up to the highest pitch, that they tried to get the congregation to contribute \$950<sup>00</sup> or \$400<sup>00</sup> & only succeeded in raising \$200<sup>00</sup> while now, at the end of a year, they are ready to add to it fifty per cent - making it \$300<sup>00</sup> when we look at it in the light of these facts, I think it is an indication of growth.

Again - we have been worshipping in an old frame building that

has been standing for  
near sixty years - you  
could ~~not~~ scarcely im-  
agine a church in much  
worse condition - Last-  
week I called a congrega-  
tional meeting to consid-  
er the matter of building  
a new church - all agreed  
that we needed a new  
church, but no one thought  
we were able to build, & so  
all wanted to put it off for  
a few years - But after a great  
deal of discussion they  
concluded to try to build  
a frame church, to cost  
about \$1600<sup>00</sup> - But I soon

found that one or two sub-  
scriptions of \$400 or \$500  
would be our start, while  
the rest that came from  
the congregation would  
consist of contributions  
varying from \$100 to \$100  
& that they would expect  
the rest ~~to be~~ <sup>to be</sup> given by  
other churches. This I  
knew would be a hopeless  
task - The fact is, they have  
never been trained to give  
to the church & have no  
idea of what they ought  
to do. So I determined to  
take the lead, & try to shunt  
them into it, if no other  
way - & accordingly I star-  
ted the subscription with  
\$1000 (all that I could  
possibly give), & while no  
one went beyond that amount

I was very much gratified  
<sup>when</sup> six others followed with  
the same amt. - making,  
from seven persons, \$700  
nearly half the amt. we  
wish to raise - we have  
not canvassed the congre-  
gation yet, but have  
not the least doubt  
that we can raise, at once,  
upwards of \$1000, which  
will enable us to go ahead  
& build this fall - Now  
when we remember, that  
this is the same congre-  
gation that told me ten  
months ago, "the ladies  
would have to get up a  
supper to put a few glasses  
in the church windows",  
it does look like the Spirit  
it must be at work.

I have gone into detail, to show that while the work is hard, there seems to be grounds for hope that they may still be led to the light - again, in examining the records, I find that while their contributions during the past year have not been what they might have been - the increase has been much larger than the proportionate increase in the number of members -

The Sunday school is doing well & I am now much in hope that we may yet have a good church there. - we have a faithful little band of Presbyterians.

ans at Corydon, but there  
is no outlook for the  
future - we are too much  
hemmed in by other church-  
es - The prospect is better  
at Uniontown - we have  
there an excellent little  
band of ladies, who keep  
the church going - There  
is material there, & pros-  
pect of growth if they  
could just have more  
preaching - I go there  
every first Sunday, &  
also every Thursday night  
before the third Sunday,  
but they ought to have  
two Sundays - we have but



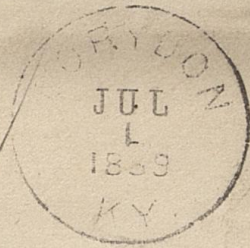
two male members  
there. Every thing is done  
by the ladies. They have  
an excellent sabbath  
school, one of them super-  
intends, opens with prayer  
&c. - They keep their build-  
ing in excellent repair -  
look after the poor & sick -  
respond liberally to all  
calls for contributions - &  
paid up their subscriptions  
before the year was out - & in  
all I think them a model  
band of church workers &  
their number is gradually  
increasing - I feel that  
the Master has been bless-  
ing my work, especially  
there at Ridgewood &  
pray that He may contin-  
ue His blessings upon the  
whole of this great work.

Remember me to Bro Eld-  
rige - & tell him he must  
come to see me before  
he goes back - I want  
to talk with him about  
the Sem. & students.

Your communication duly recd. & forwarded from Corydon<sup>Mo</sup> forwarded.  
As to condition of any field of labour, I am sorry to say that since our last meeting of Synod, there has not been the manifestation of growth I had hoped for, but am glad to say that I believe

there has been in some  
portions a steady <sup>though slow</sup> growth -  
The Corydon Ch. is very weak  
we have here less than a  
dozen members living  
in reach of the church, only  
two male members & not  
an officer - no S. school (the  
children attend union school)  
we do not know what  
change may come about  
but at present, the future  
for this church looks dark  
as the ground is thoroughly  
preoccupied -

I preach here once a month  
morning & night & in af-  
ternoon of same day to  
a Cumberland Congregation  
three miles in country

The Uniontown Church is

in better fix - we have  
there about 45 members  
enrolled, about 35 living  
in reach of church - But  
here again we have but two  
male members - but we  
have a little band of faith-  
ful lady workers, who care-  
fully look after her interests  
They keep the church build-  
ing neat & comfortable, have  
a S. school of over 60 scholars  
with an average of 45 - (conducted  
entirely by some of the ladies)  
& in every way they manifest  
a zeal & love for the Master  
& for the church - we have  
there large congregations,  
Presbyterianism is in  
favour with the people &  
we believe there is a future  
for the church, if we could

arrange to give them  
more time & preaching.

I preach there once each  
month morning & night  
& also once a month du-  
ring the week

At Ridgewood we have 80  
members - (about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of these  
were received during a meet-  
ing held there by Bro's. Evans  
& Hopper more than a year  
ago) - we have 7 elders & 5-  
deacons - The chief growth  
in this congregation du-  
ring the past year - is their  
increase in contributions  
attendance upon the house  
of worship - interest in  
S. school & church general-  
ly - we have there a good  
S. school with an average

of about 40 - It was kept  
up during the whole of  
last winter, which I believe  
was never done there before  
we have now subscribed  
over \$800<sup>00</sup> to build a  
new church, which we  
very much need -

I preach there two Sundays  
in each month, & at each  
of the three places hold  
protracted services occa-  
sionally -

This month closes another quarter in our evangelistic work - & I have been delighted to see accounts of progress in so many places. The prospect in this part of the state is a little gloomy just at this time - so many vacant churches!

During the quarter I have continued preaching one Sunday at Ridgewood - one at Uniontown & two at Marion - & preaching at

Corydon once a month during  
the week - & when the weather  
is not too bad, at mission  
points on Sunday afternoon.  
I have held communion, with  
preparatory services at each of  
the churches, except Uniontown,  
& with encouraging results -  
we had a delightful season at  
Corydon - we had communion  
there the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Nov.  
the first Sunday service they  
had had for some time - six  
were received on profession  
of faith - adding 60 percent to  
the number of communicating  
members there & the little band  
seems much encouraged - They

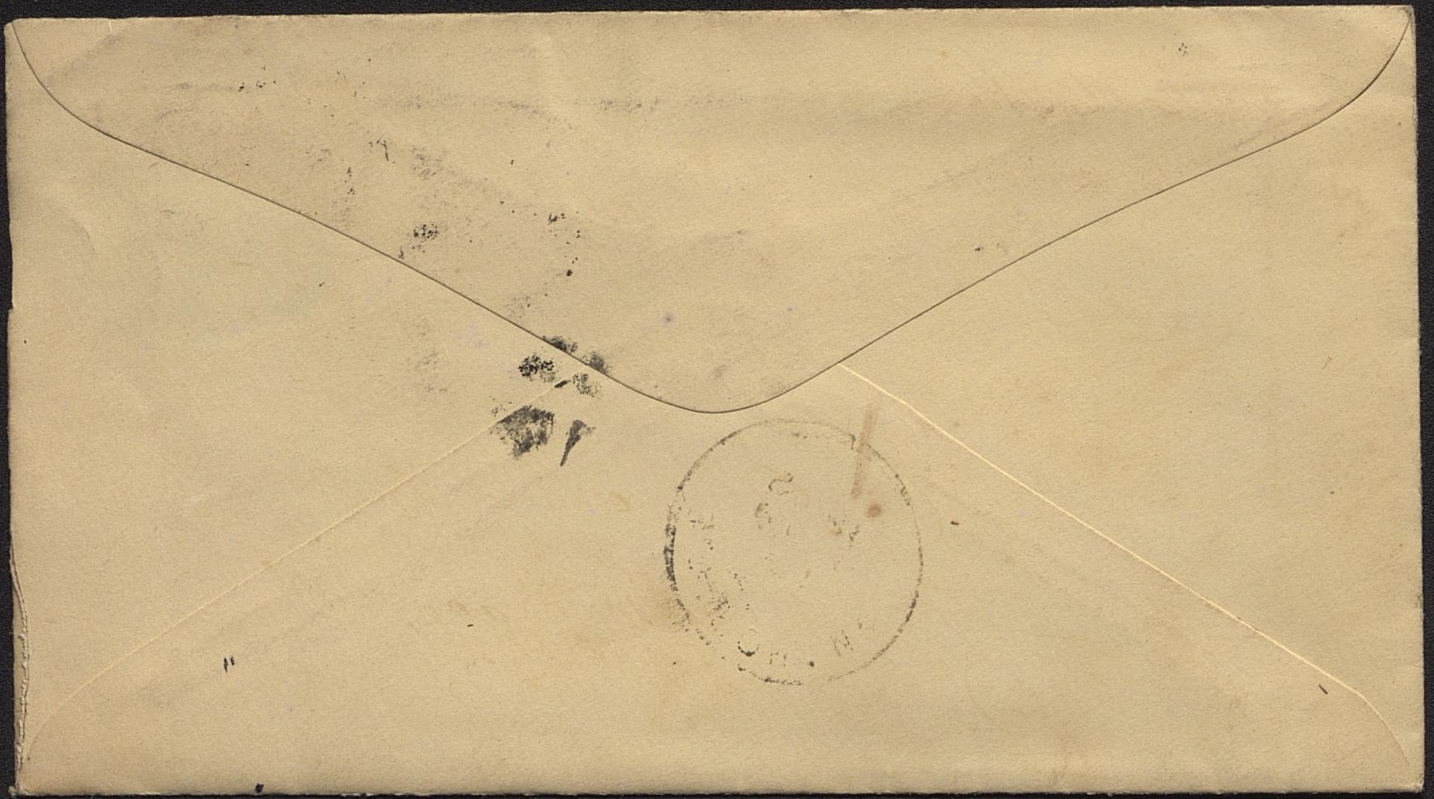

good condition. Mrs. Wiley  
has been ill most of the  
quarter just ending, & on  
that account, principally,  
I have held no special  
services during the quarter.

here, three at stungis, & giv-  
ing two afternoon sermons

To use it next Sunday for the first time. Our members are very much encouraged & are going to work in earnest. We still have a debt of about \$600<sup>00</sup> dollars on the building, but some of this has been forgiven & we hope to reduce it soon.

I have not yet secured pledges for synod work. Our principle officers here have been busily engaged in court for some time back, & have not attended to it. 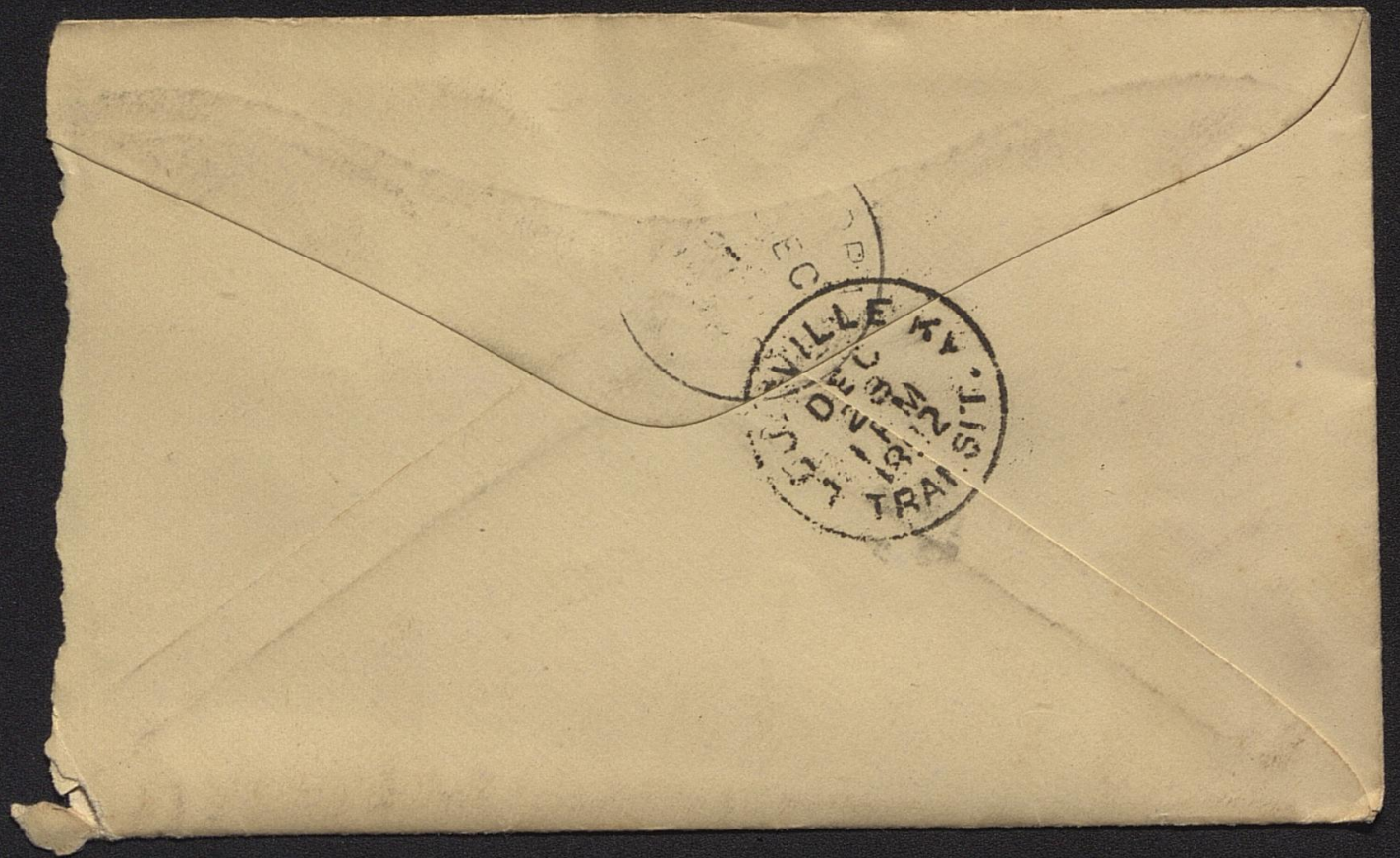

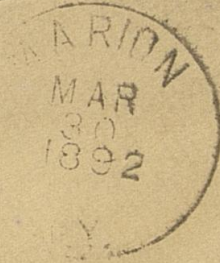

Your favor of 18<sup>th</sup> enclosing  
ck. to hand. I am sorry indeed  
that the evangelistic cause is in  
such financial straits. I have  
been hoping that my field would  
be able to relieve the Com. entirely.  
The Marion Church this year, has  
been paying 50 per ct. more to  
my salary than ever before, but  
I have received only \$32<sup>00</sup> during the  
ten months from Stungis.  
By the way with advance from previous year my salary from churches is only  
a little over 750  
We are now putting our church here  
in nice repair, at a cost of about \$25<sup>00</sup>  
we owe about \$600<sup>00</sup> on same, but  
expect to pay out this winter.  
I had a talk with Bro. Gave as we  
came down on the train, & told him  
I thought that if the Com. could

Continue aid until we get out  
of debt here. which I hope will not  
be long - we could probably shift  
for our self - But almost my  
entire support will come from  
Manion Church. while they have  
advanced largely this year. I  
doubt if a greater advance can  
be made just now -

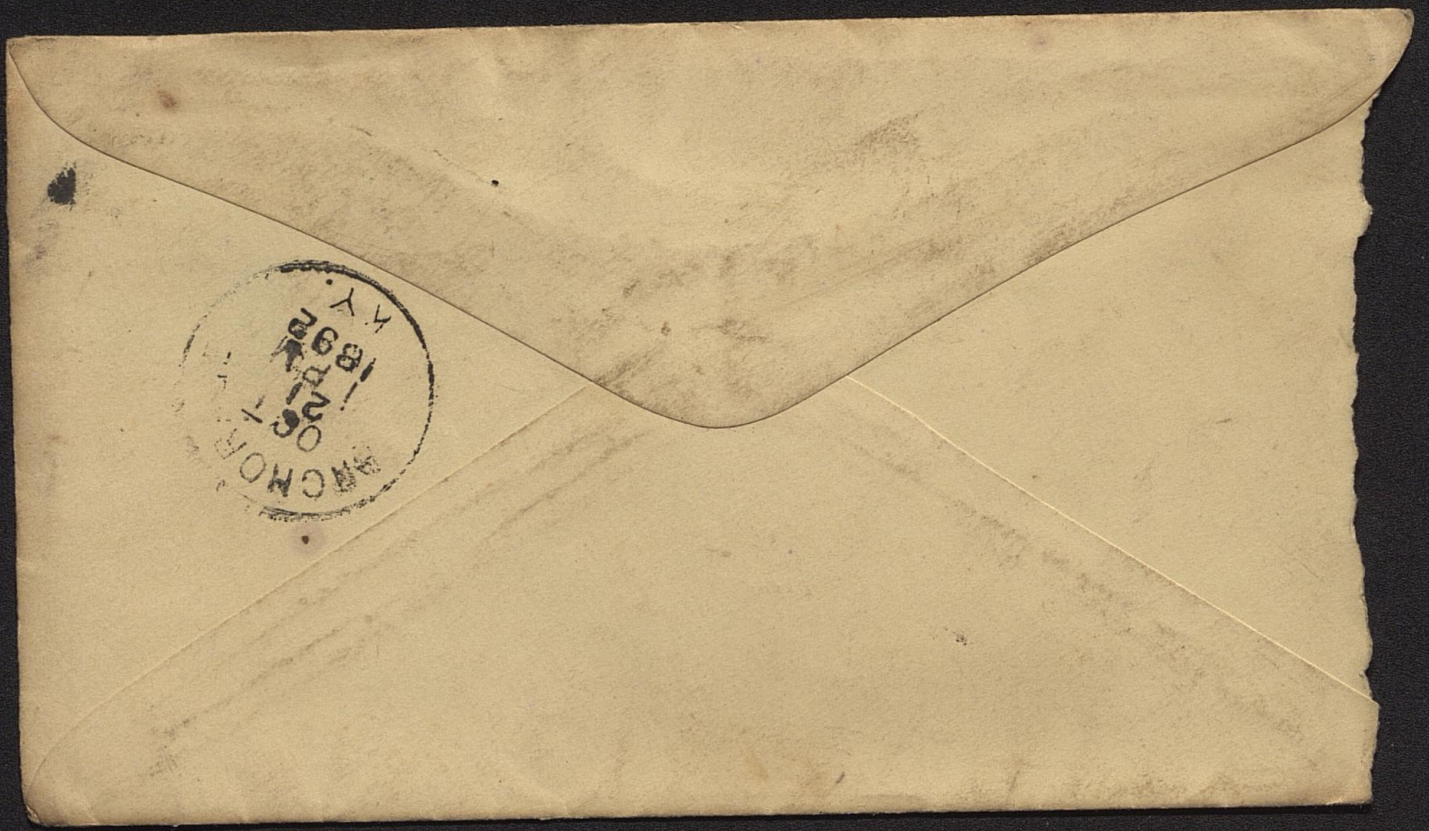

to come some time again.

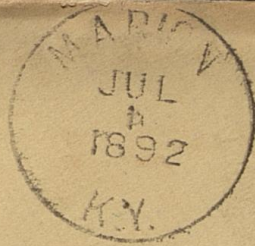
My entire field is probably

Another quarter is almost gone & I am glad to say that I believe my field of labor is continually getting in a better condition - I have been preaching three Sundays at Marion & one at Sturgis - Have also kept up two afternoon appointments in bounds of Marion congregation & preach every Sat. Evening before my regular appointment at Stur.

The membership at both places is increasing - The Sunday school here is well attended & much interest is taken in it - The church & S. school contributions have been good.

We expect to organize a S. school at Sturgis as soon as we get our house completed - The contractor has promised to have it finished within three weeks - We are moving the house from Caseyville - enlarging & changing the plan, the contract was let at \$11,000.

We are very anxious to keep free of debt - But the congregation is very weak financially & we have received ~~no~~ help outside except what was forwarded to Treas. of Syn. Com. Now if Com. can aid us to the amt. of \$200 -

it will greatly help & encourage this little band in its struggle (it has been a struggle) & I believe will enable us to start free of debt & so be able to do better work in our new home - Please write as soon as possible

are making a special effort  
for my support. The amt.

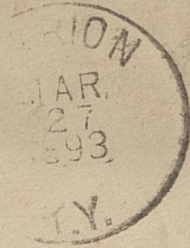

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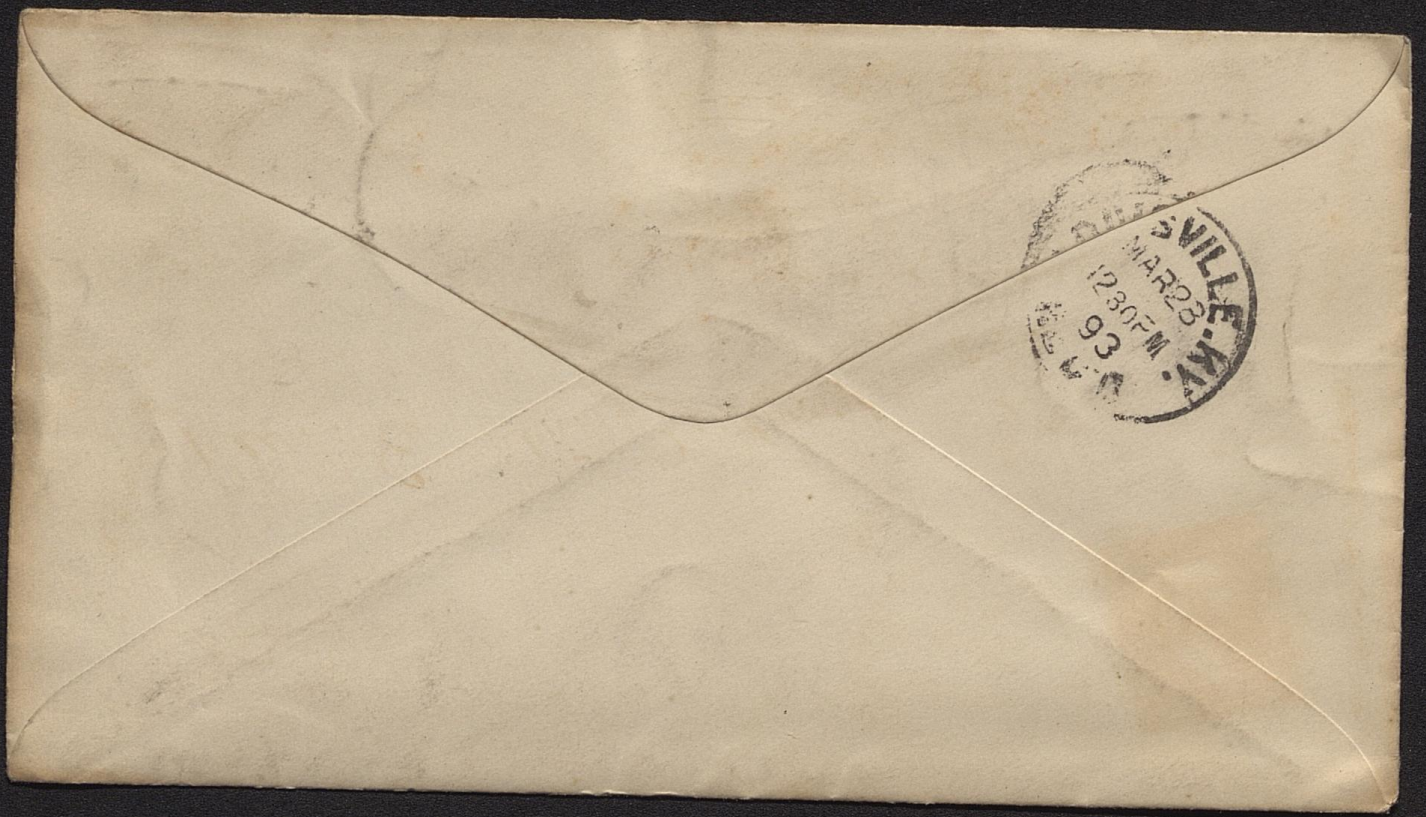
