The UK College of Nursing and the Good Samaritan Foundation, Inc. have joined together at Virginia Place on Red Mile Road to provide health care, affordable housing and child care to full-time students who are single parents who are single parents who are single parents of the following to school and working." said Michelle Kline, a nursing sophomore. "We feel health to kids. "We feel health education is important at a young age in order to establish healthy lifestyles for children," Gehring said.

Shelton, the president of UK's chapter, said she hopes the chapter expands the series next year. The chapter hopes to purchase 12 videos on human rights issues that could be shown throughout next semester.

But it would need to get other sponsors to help pay for the videos, which would cost around \$1000. The films are so expensive due to copy-right laws, Shelton said, Even if they don't join the chapter, Shelton said, viewers can learn about other ways to take action a gain the mannights abuses.

"The films show what the individual can do," she said, "and what we can pressure the government to do."

Penn brings UK 'real test' for NIT opener

Quakers' experience, range make Cats wary of atypical lvy League team - Coach Smith plans to wear them down

J.P. Blevins, UK's sophomore reserve guard, was speaking the minds of UK players and coaches when he said of Penn:
"They're not your typical Ivy League team."

UK agrees that Penn, the Cats' season-opening opponent tonight in the Chase Pre-Season NIT, has more than enough talent to cause headaches for the Cats.

That press is led by Michael Jordan. Penn's senior point guard who has what Smith called the total package.

"He's very athletic." Smith said of Jordan, a two-year all-lyty League selection who averaged 15.3 points and 3.8 rebounds per game last season. "He can put the ball on the floor," Smith said.

Jordan and his backcourt partner, Matt Langel, have started 58 straight games together. UK point guard Saul Smith said they form "one of the better backcourts in the country." But Jordan isn't the only one aching for a contest. "We're tired of hitting each other." UK's Allison said. "We want to go out and play the world."

Instead of the secondary falling apart, Wiggins and Anthony Wajda have stepped in and been amazing. Wajda has played well enough to earn consideration for All-Southeasten Conference honors.

The play of Wajda and Wiggins is a testament to the recruiting prowess of Claude Bassett and his staff, and the coaches' ability to develop young players. 



Subsidizing student fees to fund student organizations promotes independent thoughts and ideas

This past Tuesday, the U.S. Supreme Court heard argu-nts on whether public universities and colleges should be al-wed to use mandatory student fees to finance student organi-ions.

This lawsuit concerns the ongoing controversy of whether spending money equals freedom of speech. This same question has been at the root of the debates over campaign funding and the funding of groups such as the National Endowment for the Arts.

This Supreme Court case is a result of a 1996 lawsuit in which several Wisconsin law students with conservative political views sued the university.

They objected to having part of their student fees used to support 18 organizations on the university's Madison, Wisc., campus, including a campus chapter of the National Organization for Women, a socialist organization and a les-bi-gay-transgender groun.

tion for Women, a socialist organization and a les-bi-gay-trans-gender group.

True, these students may not agree with the views of cer-tain organizations on their campus.

But isn't the point of higher education to facilitate the cre-ation and development of thought?

One of the ways students can do that is through involve-ment with campus organizations—to organizations that obvious-ly need money to conduct their activities.

The potential alternative—leaving the decision of which organizations get funding up to the popular vote of the student body—could be disastrous.

Can you imagine literally hundreds of organizations lobby-ing for votes?

Can you imagine literally hundreds of organizations lobbying for votes?

Now, it's good these law students have an interest in how their money is spent. We all should be so concerned. But the important issue here is not whether you, as a student, agree with each and every idea on your campus.

The issue is whether you support an environment that allows and encourages ideas. By simply coming to college, your support of such an environment is assumed. After all, thinking is one of the fundamental reasons colleges were formed in the first place.





Pitching honors doled out

NEW YORK — Randy Johnson and Pedro Martinez became only the second and third pitchers, respectively, to win Cy Young Award in both leagues, and Martinez became only the fourth pitcher to win the American League Cy Young award unanimously and joined Gaylord Perry and Johnson as the only pitchers to win the honor in each league.

Johnson, a 6-foot-10 left-hander for the Arizona Diamondbacks, led the league in ERA and led the major leagues in strikeouts.

mondbacks, led the league in ERA and led the major leagues in strikeouts.

The "Big Unit" received 20 first-place votes, 11 seconds and one third for 134 points in balloting by the Baseball Writers Association of America.

"I'd like to think this award isn't solely based on wins and losses," said Johnson, 17-9 with a 2-48 ERA.

"There was a lot more to the season I had than wins and losses. Quite honestly, I feel still this was the best year I had in my career."

Johnson struck out 10 or more 23 times, matching the record Ryan set with the California Angels in 1973.

Martinez, 23-4 with a 2.07 ERA for the Boston Red Sox, received all 28 votes for 140 points in balloting.
