Ware asked permission to change his boarding house. He was required to procure his father's consent.

Mr. E. Sutcliffe having sold a room share to Mr. Poiriand, at what Pres. Patterson considered an exorbitant price, and having refused to rectify matters, was present to give his opinion of the transaction.

After a discussion of the subject, the faculty being nearly equally divided as to whether the price was unreasonable and whether or not any punishment should be imposed upon Mr. Sutcliffe it was resolved, as a compromise, to advise Mr. S. to satisfy Mr. P. in regard to the matter and thus relieve the faculty of the necessity of taking any further action in the matter.
