Of course, the homecoming business is rather joyful. Meeting your pals, seeing the game, attending Dr. and Mrs. McVey's tea at Maxwell place after the game (we're all invited), and then to the Alumni dance tonight at the gym . . . all of these are fun.

But what about the other angles of the situation? What about our Wildcats who now must join that ever-growing list of Wildcat immortals? Let's present each of them with a memory or so:

Ellis Johnson, one of Ashland's greatest . . . will you ever forget him for that game he played against Alabama this year? Will you ever forget his basketball playing and the team he led last season?

Darrell Darby, another of Ashland's stars . . . remember him for his fight, his versatility (he has won letters as an end, guard, and now he is a back) . . . remember him for his hard tackling, and for his basketball.

Bob Montgomery, another Ashlander . . . must we recall to you his game against Georgia Tech this year . . . sent into the line at a position he never played, he produced. That's Bob.

Ralph Blevins, the fourth of the Ashland quartet . . . he reached the height of his fighting career against V. P. I. at Blacksburg this year. We'll never forget how near he came to smashing the drive which dropped the 'Cats out of the Conference lead.

Bo Myer, Louisville's own . . . the smallest man on the squad, yet he has taken his place in the backfield with the biggest . . . remember the time he smashed through a highly touted Crimson line for 55 yards and a touchdown?

Frank Seale, the man-mountain of Big Stone Gap, Va. . . how Frank loves to battle Alabama and Tennessee . . . his brilliant game against these teams and others assures him

of a place among the greatest of the Wildcat great.

William Luther, Harlan's pride . . . a fighter from the first to the last . . . when he cracks them they stay cracked . . . not a mistake comes to mind when you survey Bill's football career.

George Skinner, a home town boy . . . he is alternate captain of the team . . . he is a fighter second to none . . . he is a scholar to the degree that he will likely be elected to Phi Beta Kappa . . . He was an end last season . . . this season he hasn't missed a game at tackle.

We have played the Wave only once on the football field, and the 'Cats took them into camp by a score of 10 to 3. The game was played here in Lexington and the year was 1910.

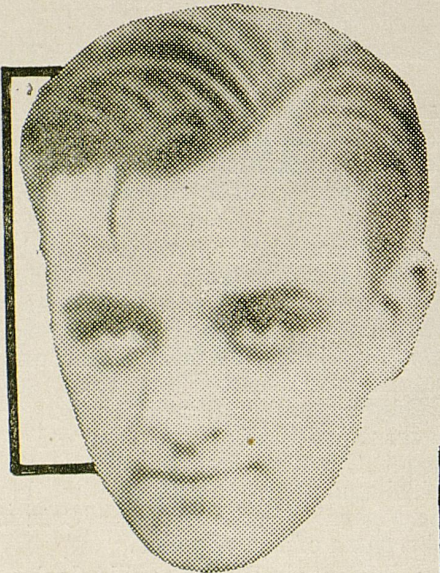

But today we have football . . . so until next year, this is "Football and Other Things" signing off.

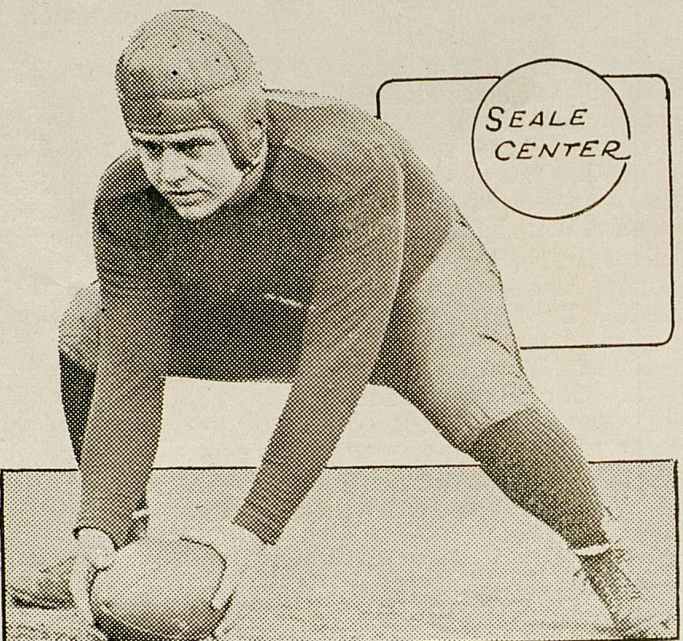
