More than 200,000 visitors come to the University of Kentucky campus each year, and the University is always glad to have them. This is a friendly place, a busy place, and there are many points of interest for the visitor to see.

With its own post office, book store, library, radio station, newspaper, theater, bowling lanes, police force, and hospital, the University is a small city in itself. The main campus, just a few minutes walk from downtown Lexington, is composed of 106 acres, while the adjoining Experiment Station farm has 600 acres. There are more than fifty major structures on the campus, including such popular attractions as the Fine Arts Building, Memorial Coliseum, Margaret I. King Library, Student Union Building, Memorial Hall, and the Museum of Anthropology.

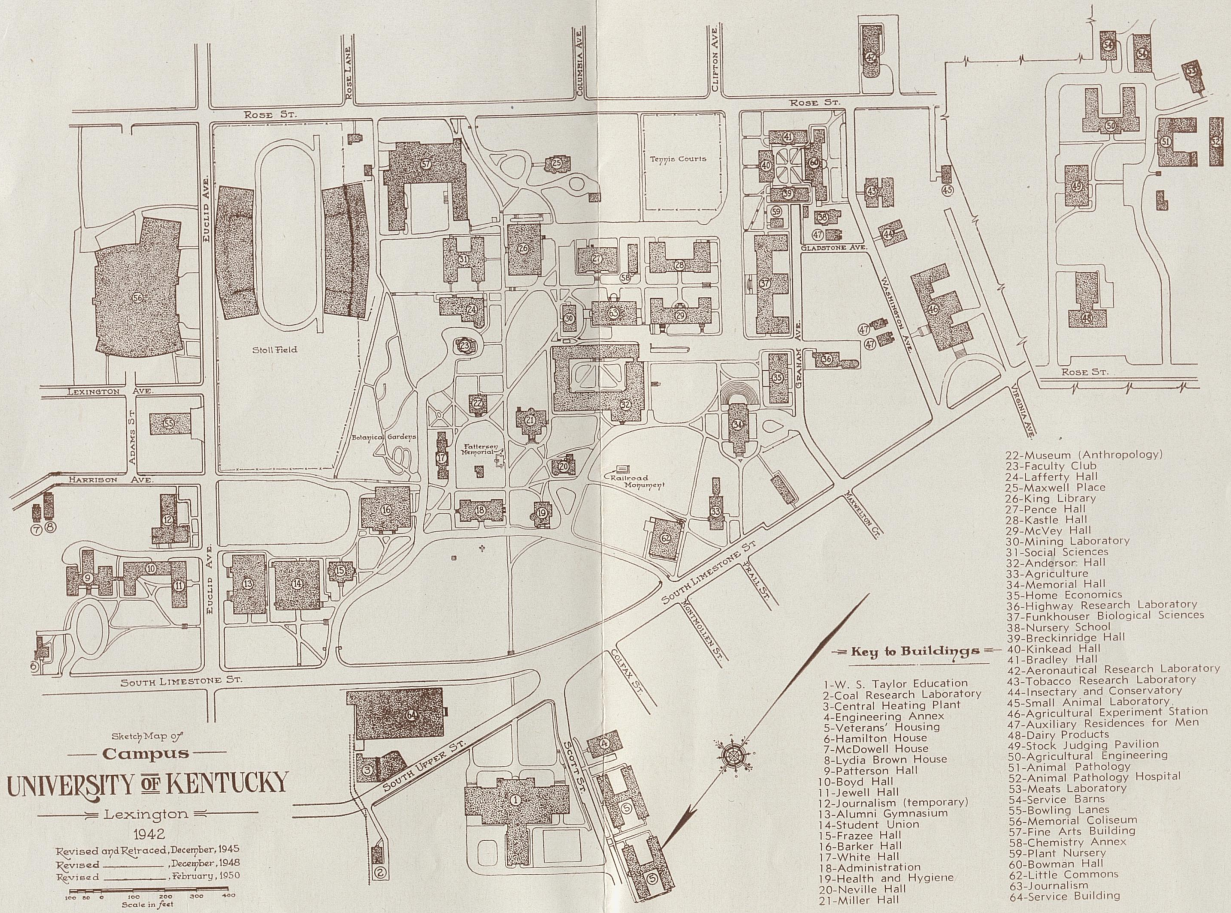
Visiting groups may arrange for guided tours of the campus with the Public Relations Department, 205 Administration Building.
