Evelyn Evans sent a clipping from page 26 of the Wall Street Journal from November 20, 1986. Donald G. Smith rated occupations on a civility scale. Not surprisingly, Mr. Smith rated librarians at 9.5 on a scale of one-to-ten. He wrote, "As a writer, I spend a lot of time in libraries. This is essential to the way I make my living, but even if it weren't I would still frequent libraries because they are such pleasant places; made so, in large part, by their staff -- which is the point of this social treatise. As a class, librarians are very nice people and therefore I like going into their world." Teachers got an 8.2, cab drivers outside of New York got a 7.0, and those in New York got a 3.8, police officers received a 5.5, and Department of Motor Vehicles employees hit the bottom with a 0.2.
