The faculty met in the President's room at 8:30 am.

All present except Dr. Pryor and Prof. Puce. The minutes of the ^{two} previous meetings were read and approved.

Prof. White reported that the committee appointed March 1, to determine the class honors for the current year, had examined the records and determined that

Miss Ella B. Terry, has an average class standing of 14.3 and that Miss Margaret L. King has an average class standing of 14.1 and that under the regulations Miss Terry is entitled to first honor, and Miss King to second honor.

On motion of Prof. Wernicke the foregoing report was received, approved, and adopted.

On motion of Prof. White ordered that a committee be appointed to prepare an appropriate programme for commencement exercises.

The Chairman appointed the Deans of the several courses of study as members of the Committee.

Prof. Anderson read the following report of a special committee from the Engineering faculties: viz.

Due to the fact that the present courses in Engineering are very much over loaded, it is necessary that some steps be taken to reduce the amount of work required each year, and the special committee appointed by the

engineering faculties, desires to make the following recommendation to the general faculty:

That the work required each term be diminished by adopting one of the following plans, and that the same be reported to the Board of Trustees for approval.

First, -- That the present freshman class in the college be designated Sub-Freshman, and that the Engineering work proper begin with the sophomore year, and extend through four years, the present sophomore class being freshman. The committee recommends that the attached scheme of study be adopted.

Second --- That plane geometry be taught in the Academy, in place of physics, and that each branch of pure mathematics, be moved forward one term.

Third --- That certain studies be dropped from the present courses in Engineering, so that during one term no student will have more than three classes that require preparation at night.
