On motion the old Board of Discipline was dissolved and another constituted, the members being Profs. McFarland, Helvoti and Kellerman.

The following resolutions were adopted:

Resolved: that five minutes only be allowed for change of classes and that Profs. close doors at expiration of that time; that the Pres. and Profs. concerned may make exception in special cases application being previously made; that each Prof. as a rule keep his class the entire hour; that no Prof. shall admit any student to class instruction after his classification without permission of the Pres. and Prof. concerned.
