He first came to Kentucky in 1927 as assistant to Harry Gamage, head football coach, but gave up coaching for four years after developing great Wildcat lines in seven gridiron seasons. The term "Shively-coached line" became a byword for excellence in football. Now the supporters of the Wildcats have called him back to the gridiron. Once more the Wildcat line coach, Shively also is athletic director. He was an all-America guard at Illinois in 1926, won his bachelor of Arts Degree at Illinois and his Master's Degree at the University of Kentucky.
