George Bernard Shaw called RECOLLECTIONS "fatuous," but being written for a youthful audience it tends toward simplicity and melodrama, rather than the hypercerebral analysis Shaw brought to his play SAINT JOAN. My only real disappointment with the book was the ending. Surely a writer of Twain's genius could have come up with a more gratifying ending than having the patriotic and saintly heroine burned at the stake, but I suppose even the best writers pander to sensationalism at times to assure book sales.
