Active in Disciple Ministry 40 Years, North Carolina Pastor Dies Of Pneumonia

Joseph Willis Hagin, pastor of Broad Street Church, New Bern, N. C., and active in the Disciple ministry since 1901, died suddenly on Apr. 16, with pneumonia. Mr. Hagin was born in Shelby County, Ky., Mar. 9, 1875. He was educated in Transylvania College, The College of the Bible, and The University of Chicago. His first pastorate was at Stanford, Ky., 1901-04. He was pastor of Fourth Street Church (now Madison Avenue), Covington, Ky., 1905-27; and at First Church, Ashland, Ky., 1927-37; and at New Bern, 1937-41.

Mr. Hagin served twice as president of the Kentucky state convention, and served as trustee of The College of the Bible, director of the Kentucky Missionary Society, member of the Board of Managers of The United Society and of the Executive Committee, and member and trustee of the Board of Church Extension. He was president of the New Bern Ministerial Association.

Mr. Hagin was married to Roberta Lewis Cash of Stanford, Ky., in December, 1901, who died in August, 1931. Surviving are a son, Robert Hart Hagin, and a daughter, Mrs. Charlton Alexander Howard, both of Covington; and four sisters.

Funeral services were held at Madison Avenue Church, Covington, on Apr. 18, with Pastor Kenneth B. Bowen officiating. Burial was at Stanford.
