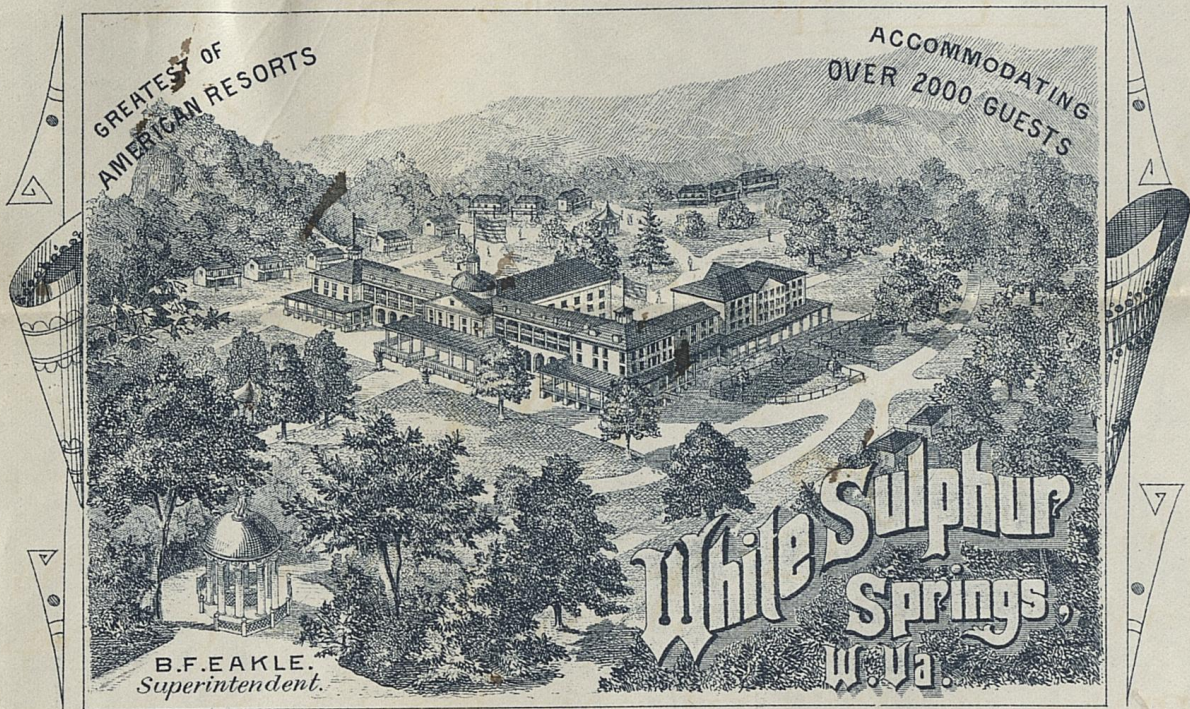

if I can do so Monday morning.

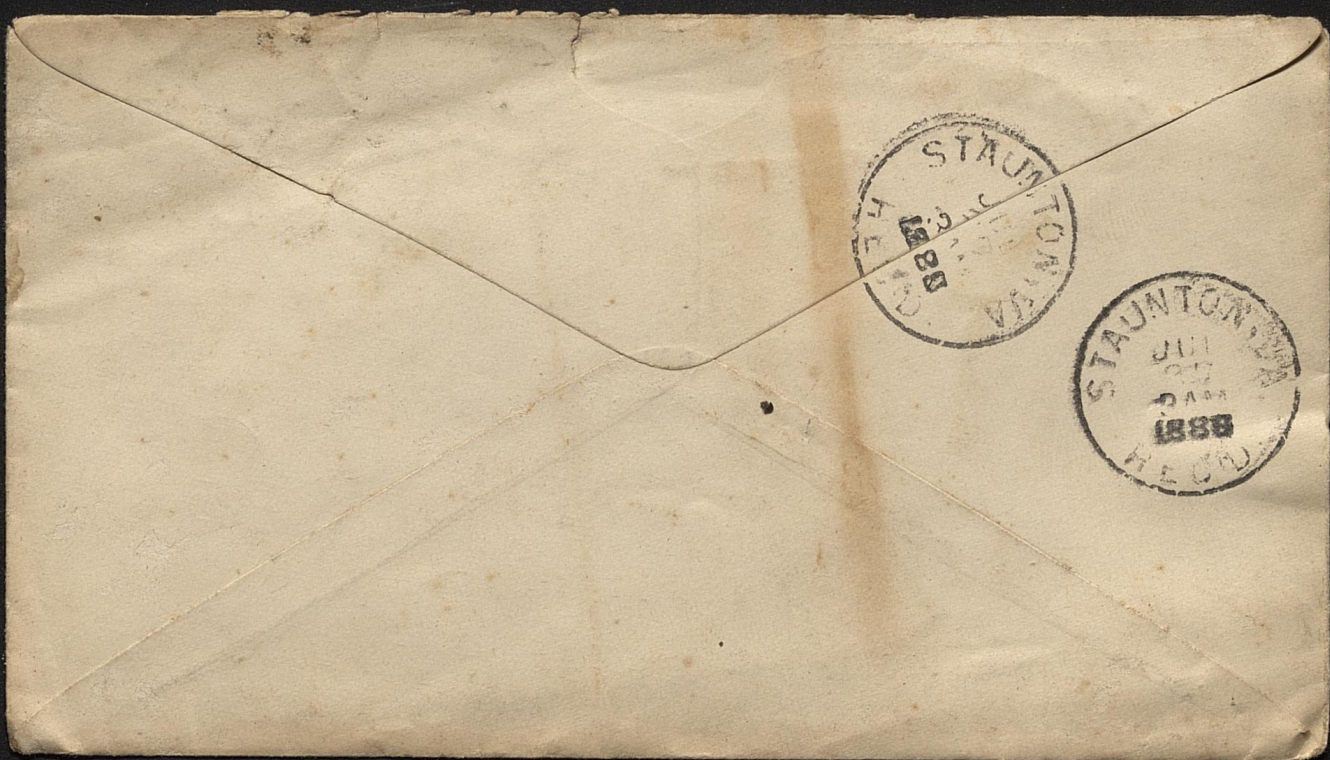
