WKU student's family sues school after rape
The family of a Western Kentucky University
freshman who was beaten, stabbed, raped and
burned in her dormitory room filed a wrongfuldeath lawsuit against the school Thursday, alleg-The family of a Western Kentucky University reshman who was beaten, stabbed, rapped and burned in her dornitory room filed a wrongful-death lawsuit against the school Thursday, alleging it failed to enforce its security policies. Katie Autry, 18, died three days after the May attack. Two men from Scottsville, Ky, near the school in Bowling Green, have been charged with murder and other charges. Autry's aunt, Virginia Whise, said the suit is intended to "ensure that another young lady never has to suffer like Katie did" Western Kentucky said in a statement that it was confident "neither its staff nor its policies played a role in this tragic event." The lawsuit dalso names as defendants the WKU Student Life Foundation, which owns the residence halls, the PI Kappa Alpunca B. Goodrum and Stephen B. Soules, were not named in the suit. Autry and the two suspects are believed to have attended a party at the fraternity hours before the attack. Ben Crocker, an attorney for Autry's family, said there were lax controls about who attended and that alcohol was served. Crocker said he had information indicating the dorm's outside doors were not locked the night Autry was attacked. Crocker said he believed that her assailants did not leave identification cards at the front desk and were allowed tog to her room without an escort. The university said that an independent campus safety task force reported that proper security policies were in place at the time Autry was attacked.





Todd takes a big step toward more diversity

Since 1991, UK Lambda, has been representing gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender com-

But until Wednesday night, the student orga nization, and those it represents have received scant attention from the UK administration.

President Lee Todd and other administrators did well to speak and talk with students at Lambda's Wednesday meeting. When Todd took over as president in 2001, he spoke at length of his intent toward increasing

diversity on campus. Another important step to-ward this goal was made at the Lambda meet-

Ing.

Lambda represents an oft-marginalized cross-section of UK's campus, and the university would be errant to ignore or exclude this segment of the community.

Todd's attendance at the meeting shows a good-faith effort at making the campus open and inclusive, and we applaud this effort.

But in keeping with the need for this kind of inclusiveness, it won't be enough for Todd to attend a couple of meetings and stop there.

We also look forward to seeing Todd follow through with the dialogue he and Lambda initiated Wednesday. This means addressing specifics and gathering input from a wide range sources.

Todd said that he has plans already to conduct a sexual orientation survey of the student body in the spring. One person attending the meeting suggested that GLBT demographics on campus be included in UK literature, and we

Another issue that came up at the meeting is the possibility of an explicitly "hate-free," GLBT-tolerant dorm.

We agree with Todd's response that this

Fairness Doctrine should remain dormant

fears that Murdoch is planning to silence the liberal voice (he's conservative) are overblown.

Is it realistic to think that every journalist that works for Murdoch's company for that matter, has the same political views as the CEO or board members? Journalists are as free to express their voices as they have ever been. For now.

Members of Congress—mostly Democrats, but some Republicans as well—are giving more and more attention to legislation known as the Fairness Doctrine.

The Fairness Doctrine is a piece of legislation originally passed in 1949 to promote "diversity" in the issues. The law, as developed by the FCC "imposes upon broadcasters at two-pronged obligation. Broadcast licensees to provide coverage of vitally im-

portant issues of interest in the community served by the licensee and provide a reasonable opportunity for the presentation of contrasting viewpoints on such issues."

The problem with this doctrine is it regulates media in a way that is unconstitutional. The First Amendment says that "Congress shall make no law ... abridging freedom of speech, or of the press, cause there is limited airspace in which to broadcast TV or radio signals, but does that really justify government regulation of these media to this extreme?

In 1897 the PCC announced it would no longer enforce the Fairness Doctrine. Congress heatened to pass in the propers of the pro

such a resolution.

If passed, this legislation would force media to engage in "fair" practices. Media companies would be forced to air other shows to balance contrasting views. This would mean that Fox News would need to balance shows such as "The O'Reilly Factor" or the stations broadcasting the "Rush Limbaugh Show would have to find a liberal radio program to balance the lineup.

Many stations would drop talk radio, which leans toward a conservative slant in the views articulates. Stations would be revenue by dropping some conservative shows to less popularity that the program of t

versity on the airwaves. It did just the opposite. In 1980, there were just over 300 news radio stations. Now, there are over 1,300 talk radio stations, most of which sprang up soon after the Fairness Doctrine was no longer enforced. Rush Limbaugh is given credit by some for reviving talk radio. Do you think it was by mistake that his show went national two months after the Fairness Doctrine was, in essence, repealed?

It's OK to despise or laud Limbaugh for his bombastic style and his snide remarks about liberals. It's OK to despise or laud The New York Times for fair the New York Times for fair the condorse a Republican presidential candidate since Dwight Eisenhower. However, we don't need to censor individuals we don't agree with.



The 6-foot shooting guard averaged 19.4 points, 7.1 rebounds and 3.2 steals a game last season at South Doyle High School in Knoxville.

Buley was named a USA Today sophomore All-American and recently attended the Nike All-American Camp.

In Tennessee she received immense attention from all over, in particular from the Laday Volunteers, "She stated showing interest in me when she was at Tennessee," Buley said, "If she was still at Tennessee, I would probably have gone there."
