My Dear Little Children

I thought I would write you a few lines what in the world has come over you all I have had no Letter from either of you for going on two months I can not think what is the reason I wrote to you ada and got not answer to it I am here at uncle franks now I have been here three weeks Last tuesday your aunt sue has had a felon on the fore finger of her left hand you know what it is it is a bealed finger it has been very sore and I came out to nurse her finger it is almost well now she can work a little with it but she had an awful time poor Aunt sue she could not sleep at night for it it pained her so bad I am so

glad it is better so this is what I
am doing here your uncle frank went
to over to Hollidaysbury last night
and was at Grandmas & and I
told him if they had got any Letters
for me to send them with him to
me and he come home today but brava
ght me no Letter well ada I was so
disappointed I could have cryed I just
thought has my Little Children forgotte
me or what is the matter now I
I hope ada you will write to your
own mother who thinks so much
about you if you would only write
to me every two or three weeks I
would be satisfied but when you
write dont address it to Henrietta
but to Hollidaysbury for I dont
expect to be here much longer
I have been having a very nice time
while I have been here the first
Sunday I was here your uncle frank

took me to Martinsbury to
Church in a two horse sleigh it was
Grand good sleighing and is yet and
I have had several sleigh rides since
now my Dear Little ones I must
close for your Cousin Molly is going
to mail this for me now ada dont
forget to write as soon as you get
this Lots of Love my Dear Little

I had Letter from your uncle Jim

he had been teaching school at Pine
Flat Indiana so this winter he likes
to hear how you all are getting along
I met John the other day on the
street he told me he had moved on
burnses farm he said in the fall
when the apples was ripe I must
come and get as many as I wanted
wont that be nice they have a very
Large orchard right at the back door
wouldnt you have a nice time going
to Johns house if you were here
I was out at uncle franks this
winter tell Georgie I saw dolly she
was as fat and as nice as ever Little
suey would go out and pick her
up bring her in and the Dear Little
thing she would sit wherever suey
would put her Grandpa is going to
Let her hatch some Little chickens

if she wants to uncle frank has quite
a lot of chickens but he thinks a great
deal of dolly
giving you will find in this letter
a card from Miss Annie Mc Clark
she sends it to you with her love ~~to~~
tell Georgie that Mary will often
ask me about him ~~to~~ she told me
to send her love to him when I would
write buy bobinger Luce henry ~~inquire~~
about him they want to know when
he is coming home I tell them I guess
they wont know Georgie and he
wont know them when he comes home
tell your Dear Little sister I have been
waiting on an answer to my last
letter to her I want to know if she
got the Money safe I sent her I
feel very anxious about it tell her
to let me know soon I will be

from you all tell Jimmy and Georgie
I am waiting patiently for their
Letter tell them to write soon
Ada & did not get any more tating
pat~~ing~~ terms yet but I will try to
get some again the next time I
write remember me to Mrs
Carmichael and all Give Lots of
Love to my Dear Little Jimmie & Georgie
and the same to my Little Ada
from your Loving Mother

I received your very interesting
Letter Ada it was more interesting
to me than any you have written
since you have been in the Home
stead I am very much pleased with
the presents you made for Mrs Carmi-
chael I think it was so nice for
you all to remember her on her
birth day for she is so good and
kind and I all she had given to
her was not a bit to good for her
and I know you all think that

Ada I gave I your Letter to Mr
rollin to read and he said I could
not have pleased him better than
by giving him your Letter to read
he was so much pleased about it
he had to tell the Sunday school
about it he said he was going to
write to you soon if he does ada
you must answer it he would
have written to you before this but
he was sick with the rheumatism
this winter he was for about seven
Sundays that he wasent at Sunday
School and we were all so glad to see
him when he came and he was just
as glad to see us he went around

Limping for he was very lame
through the school and shook hands
with all he is a little lame yet but
is pretty nearly well now
your uncle frank was here to day
and took your Grandma home with
him and there is no body at home
now but your Aunt Mill and my
self for will is in Harrisburg his
brothers Dave and frank were here
on a visit and will had no work
so he thought it best to go with
his brothers they said he could get
work there tell Georgie that Grand
papa was very much pleased
with his Letter and glad to hear
