## UK to repeat violence against women survey

UK will update its current statistics on vio-lence against women, which state that 36.5 per-cent of women will experience sexual or physical assault, or stalking during their time at UK, by conducting a women's safety study. UK's Center for Research on Violence Against Women will handle the women's safety study over the next six weeks. The center first conducted the anonymous telephone survey in 2004. The pur-pose of conducting it again is to learn if progress has been made over the past three years, Carol Jordan, the center's director, told the Kernel in an e-mail.

"We want to see empirically where our progress lies and how our strengths and weaknesses have evolved so that we can continue to address violence against women in the most effective way," Jordan said.

UK surveyed 1010 women in 2004. The number of participants will increase to 2,000 this variety of participants will increase to 2,000 this variety of the center better estimate the effects violence has on smaller populations within UK, Jordan said.

"It will help us understand more about different racial and ethnic groups, about rural versus urban women, and other differences," Jordan said.

Another difference for this year's survey is UK inviting Kentucky State University to participate. This collaboration will help KSU identify

of the realities and perceptions of women's safety on campus, Blanton said.

"Safety is an ongoing issue and can always be improved on." he said.

UK is a strong leader in this type of research because of its approach in evaluating students' experiences rather than measuring other universities.

"I believe we approached this problem the right way." Jordan said. "UK can be proud of its substantial efforts to address the safety of those who live, learn and work on this campus."

Violence can affect women in many ways, including academically, she added.

### **UK Senate asks** Trustees to reconsider agenda policy

The University Senate is unhappy with a recent administrative decision to restrict access to the Board of Trustees' fill meeting agendas until 9 a.m. the day of full board meetings.

Senate Council Chair Kaveh Tagavi presented a letter written by the council for approval at yesterday's University Senate meeting "respectfully requesting" that the new posting practice be reconsidered.

Senators present at the meeting unanimously approved the letter, which also requested that the board continue its "tradition of transparency" at UK.
Senator JW. Yates said delaying access to board agendas is a bad public relations practice.

"The objection of the Senate is that this is going to tend to make the Board of Trustee's agenda look secretive," Yates said. "Why put it on such a short timetable?"

### Talks continue over longer Fall Break

The University Senate debated the Calendar Committee's recommendation to combine Fall Break and the Thanksgiving holiday into a weeklong break at yesterday's meeting. Some senators said the proposal, which would eliminate two days from the fall semester, was logical, while others said giving students a week off at Thanksgiving was not the right time for a break of this length.

"It thought it was a very healthy discussion that raised very important academic issues," said Calendar Committee Chair Ernie Yanarella.

The discussion became focused on two potential options — the original recommendation as presented to the board and an alternative proposal of eliminating the current fall break and giving students the day off the Wednesday before Thanksgiving, Yanarella said.

Sen. Suzanne Segerstrom said the weeklong break close to the end of the semester was "logical and reasonable" because many students already miss classes the Wednesday before Thanksgiving. She added that students could use the extra time preparing

Other senators voiced concern over the academic consequences of eliminating two instructional days in the fall semester to create a break symmetrical to Spring Break.

Sen. Bob Grossman disagreed with the plan saying he was very uncomfortable with eliminating additional instructional days, adding that maybe the senate should consider adding one or two more cays of class to the spring semester if symmetrical semesters was the calendar committee's goal.

#### **Arboretum construction** looks to limit storm flooding

The UK Arboretum is undergoing construction worth almost
\$500,000 to reduce flooding of
nearby neighborhoods.

The Lower West Glendover
Drainage Improvement Project is a
partnership among UK, the city
and neighbors. The goal of the project is to change part of the arboretum near Glendover Road to reduce
heavy runoff from storm waters.

Portions of the pawed trail will
be closed for construction through
July.

"I hope that (the construction)
goes very smoothly and very
quickly," said Arboretum Director
Reunoff is a problem in urban
areas like Lexington because storm
sewers and drainage ditches overflow many times after heavy rain.

The construction project in the

arboretum will reduce flooding by converting part of the arboretum's Walk Across Kentucky pathway into a holding area that will eventu-ally be home to plants that will help lessen runoff, Farris said. Walk Across Kentucky, a two-mile pawed pathway, is divided into seven areas representing the differ-ent geophysical regions of Kentucky, according to the arboretum Web site. The area undergoing con-struction is the Mississippi Embay-ment region.



House Bill 70, which would allow Kentucky voters to decide on whether or not to restore non-violent felons' voting rights, was up for debate at the time, and was lat-



er passed by the House of Representatives. The bill will now be considered by the Sentae. If passed, the issue will appear on the 2008 ballot for final consideration by Kentucky citizens. We argued previously in similar cases, felons who have been released from prison have paid their debt to society. When they have already been punished for their crimes. Punishing someone for a crime once they have already been punished is both unjust and unconstitutional.
